The 2014 National Design Awards recognize excellence and innovation


The Smithsonian's Cooper-Hewitt, National Design Museum recently announced the winners of its prestigious 2014 National Design Awards. Winners in a variety of disciplines were selected by jury for the level of excellence, innovation and public impact of their work.

Almost all of the awardees hail from New York and California. The Architecture Design award went to LA-based Brooks + Scarpa, a firm noted for its cutting-edge work as well as for designing the first affordable housing project in the country to be LEED-Gold certified.

The New York firm Roman and Williams Buildings and Interiors, founded in 1998 by Hollywood set designers Robin Standefer and Stephen Alesch, won the Interior Design award. An übercool, industrial edge characterizes the company's portfolio, which ranges from New York's Ace Hotel to a newsroom and set for "Huffington Post Live." The Landscape Architecture award went to San Francisco-based Andrea Cochran Landscape Architecture, which focuses on sustainability in projects ranging from singlefamily homes to schools, affordable housing, public parks and institutions. New York-based Narciso Rodriguez won the Fashion Design award for his "modern-classic" apparel, while Etsy won the Corporate & Institutional Achievement award for building a marketplace that supports one million creative businesses.

During National Design Week from October 4 to 12, a series of special events will take place in New York and Washington, including an awards gala in New York on October 9. For more information, visit cooperhewitt.org. —Sharon Jaffe Dan



SHOW ME THE WAY

The BIG Maze at the National Building Museum welcomes explorers of all ages

visit to the National Building Museum this summer might require a bit more path finding than usual—if you dare to enter the BIG Maze, that is. The Danish architecture firm BIG-Bjarke Ingels Group partnered with the museum to construct its first large-scale building installation in 26 years: a maze that spans 3,721 square feet and reaches up to 18 feet tall. When the Baltic birch plywood structure opens to the public in the museum's Great Hall on July 4th, visitors of all ages will be able to explore its complex passageways at ground level—or enjoy a bird's-eye view of the action from the second- and third-floor balconies.

Towering walls conceal the inner workings of the cube-shaped maze, which measures 61 feet wide on each side. Inside, the walls decrease in height as travelers near the center, revealing the logic behind the design. "The concept is simple. As you travel deeper into a maze, your path typically becomes more convoluted," says architect Bjarke Ingels of his design. "What if we invert this scenario and create a maze that brings clarity and visual understanding upon reaching the heart of the labyrinth?" At the center of the maze, a "grand reveal" will provide a 360-degree understanding of the pathway in and out.

In addition to the BIG Maze, a number of other special events will take place as part of the National Building Museum's Summer Block Party. Highlights include special tours of the maze as it's being constructed on June 27, June 30 and July 1; late-night hours; and pop-up cookouts on the museum's West Lawn, catered by Hill Country Barbecue, every Thursday to Saturday until Labor Day. The BIG Maze remains open until September 1. For more information, visit nbm.org. —Alex Stoller

The Big EASY

Designer Kathryn Ivey gives a Capitol Hill home a New Orleans-style makeover

hen the Lukken family bought their fourbedroom Capitol Hill row house in 2011, they knew an extensive renovation lay in their not-too-distant future. A sociable couple with three kids under the age of ten, they wanted the home to reflect their taste and align with their lifestyle.

"The house was nicely appointed but somewhat dated, with a darker palette-lots of maroons, beiges and forest greens. It also had very formal moldings and fixtures," recalls DC-based interior designer Kathryn Ivey, who was hired by the owners to revamp their house in 2013. "It was the home of a sophisticated older woman versus one for an active young family of five."

Though the Colonial-style row house was built only ten years ago, its exterior blends

seamlessly with the area's period homes. However, with polished wood floors and shiny brass fixtures, the interiors smacked of new construction. A plan evolved that would lend the new home a sense of history and timeless character. "My client is originally from Louisiana," says Ivey. "She loves the rustic yet elegant New Orleans style, with its weathered finishes, rich natural materials and Old World sensibility. I wanted to bring these timeless elements into the home and better connect it to its historic neighborhood."

Working with Claire McLane of Residential Concepts and builder Ryan Keith of Redux Garden + Home, Ivey finalized plans for a first-floor remodel that would open up the layout and improve circulation between the foyer, living room, dining room and kitchen.

To achieve this, a superfluous wall separating the kitchen and dining room came down, as did ornate double columns dividing the living and dining rooms. "We wanted to preserve the openness," explains Ivey, "but maintain differentiation between these two spaces, so we bricked the

drywall supports and created a brick arch."

The interior brickwork imparted instant character, adding a desired "forever there" component to the home. Ivey created spatial definition in the now-open floor plan while continuing to add details that would "age" the house. She paved the foyer with coarse Tennessee bluestone, and replaced builder-grade mahogany floors throughout with custom-planked old-growth hickory from Vermont in a foot-worn finish. She also installed a tongue-in-groove painted wood ceiling in the refurbished kitchen.

"The kitchen was completely gutted and redone," says Ivey. "Opening it up really lent itself both to relaxed entertaining at home and hectic everyday life with the kids."

A sliding barn door (above, left) leads down to the basement, imparting a rustic touch. Wallpaper defines the dining area wall (above, right), where a built-in desk doubles as a bar when the couple is entertaining. A new bricked-in arch (opposite) makes a powerful yet subtle statement, as does the wood chandelier above the dining table.









Two wrought-iron lanterns provide New Orleans-style lighting above the island, which is topped in Absolute Granite with a user-friendly leather finish. This is where the kids grab quick meals and food prep takes place. A farmhouse apron sink, marble perimeter counters and paneled, Shaker-style cabinets with aged brass hardware add further definition.

"All the finishes in this home are really important," says Ivey. "They are textural yet refined, with all the warmth of natural materials."

She took a similar approach to the cleanlined, traditional furnishings. French-inspired bentwood chairs with X-backs and caned seats pull up to a distressed-wood oval dining table, while seating in the living area includes a pair of powder-blue slipcovered armchairs and an oatmeal-hued linen sofa. Aged brass, rubbed bronze and

wrought iron are used throughout as metal accents. Adult sophistication pairs with family comfort in each nook.

"We painted almost everything soft white," says Ivey of the largely neutral canvas, "but we also wanted a light and airy historical color palette for select accents."

Timeless hues such as sage green, caramel tan and Colonial blue quietly enhance the neutrals in the form of small accessories and throw pillows, as well as in carpets and artwork. Punches of black on the ebonized stair rail and painted front door add dramatic flair.


Ivey made her boldest color statement in the living area, where she painted the fireplace mantel light tan and the matching built-in bookshelves a muted blue. "The decision to add the infusion of color to these architectural features was definitely more European," says the designer, who has spent time in Provence. "In America, we tend to color the walls and keep the trim white or stained. I did the exact opposite. It's a different expression of color. And it was another way to bring that French influence into the home."

Other inspired details include the Moravian star fixture, casting points of light in the foyer; needlepoint-embroidered pillows, layering in texture; and pale Roman shades, with their playful pompom trim, filtering sunlight and adding warmth.

"The house speaks to that New Orleans style of living," says Ivey of the home's irresistible charm. "The homeowners are a fun couple who love to entertain. Now, they can comfortably interact with their guests and keep track of their young family."



The host of TLC's "Say Yes to the Dress: Atlanta" opens the doors to his longtime Alexandria home

onte Durham greets visitors with what can only be described as Southern hospitality. The West Virginia native is recognized wherever he goes for his high-profile role on the pre-nuptial reality show, yet his feet stand firmly on the ground—as well as in the beloved Belle Haven home he's shared with his longtime partner, Jakob Evans, for the last 20 years.

The 70-year-old house, a graceful, welcoming center-hall Colonial, perfectly reflects Durham's personality and style. It's traditional, brimming with 19th-century antiques yet punctuated by whimsical personal touches in the form of artwork and family heirlooms. It's also a labor of love: Over the years, Durham has put in much of the work on it himself. In fact, it only recently underwent a professional renovation, of which Durham and Evans are justly proud.

Home & Design visited the couple while

the remodel—which encompassed the kitchen, a new breakfast room and adjoining breezeway and a basement office—was still wrapping up. Durham is an avid collector of Jackie Kennedy memorabilia (an interest gleaned from his mother, whose fascination began during the glamorous Kennedy era), and a tour of the house features a room showcasing a gallery of photos and an exact replica of the First Lady's wedding dress. He also collects antique china; sometimes these interests overlap,

as in an array of stemware on display in the kitchen, originally ordered by Jackie Kennedy for the White House and scooped up from an online source by Durham.

explains. "And I figure if I do it myself I can change it. It allows freedom without conversation—I don't have to convince anyone of anything!"

Durham recently painted the dining room a warm gray that provides the perfect background for a collection of blue-and-white Delftware. The space is furnished with antiques, including a grandfather clock bought in San Diego, sideboards and a china cabinet. Crate & Barrel draperies have been trimmed with fringe to give them a more formal air. "I tend to go very formal," Durham observes. "I like damask and silk." In the cheerful yellow parlor, formality and warmth unite

with heavy silk drapes, stately camelbacked sofas and a grand piano.


The renovated kitchen synthesizes the traditional aesthetic found in the rest of the house with a more modern, updated look, conveyed partly by a fresh lemongrass hue on the walls and gray-painted cabinetry. A beveled subway-tile backsplash in Carrara marble matches the island countertop, creating a timeless look.

The kitchen opens out to a breakfast room with a vaulted barn ceiling and a window seat that overlooks the backyard—now home to a breezeway and patio. To house outdoor plants, Durham spray-painted large planters from the gro-



cery store. "We want to think about how much money we spend on certain things," he comments. "A pot for outside, I'm going to think about. But for upholstery, I make the investment."

While Durham clearly has an affinity for interiors, fashion has always been his first love. He began his career as a personal shopper in DC, where he found that "women wanted someone who could tailor their clothes and do their hair," he recalls. "I said, 'I can't sew but I bet I can do hair.' So I got a hair degree in London, then came back and went to work as artistic director for Elizabeth Arden for 12 years."

After styling hair for a bridal show in Tysons Corner, he discovered his niche. "I

got booked with 12 weddings immediately," he says. "I was listed as most preferred for hair and makeup in *Washingtonian* in 2000. So I said, 'I think I better run with this!"

Durham met Lori Allen, his TV cohost, when he did hair and makeup for her daughter's wedding, which was broadcast on WE TV. Allen, who owns a bridal shop in Atlanta, had been approached by The Learning Channel about hosting a spinoff of the New York-based reality show, "Say Yes to the Dress," in Atlanta. She brought in Durham, and the rest is history.

These days, a diverse career keeps Durham very busy. In between trips to Atlanta for filming, he's launched a haircare line, Monte Durham (available through salonstudio.com), and is considering designing his own line of tuxedos. He reports on fashion for CNN with Brooke Baldwin, and covered the Royal Wedding for TLC in 2011. He frequently visits his family in West Virginia, where he plans to open a Durham's upstairs office (above, left and right) is a paean to Jackie Kennedy, with an exact replica of her wedding dress (boasting 50 yards of silk taffeta like the original); a gallery of photographs and memorabilia; and an original Kennedy rocking chair.

hairdressing school outside Charleston in the fall.

Durham and Evans, a retired government worker, married in October 2013 when the ban on same-sex unions was lifted in DC (their wedding festivities made the newspapers). The couple shares their home with Nellie Belle, a cossetted 12-year-old Welsh terrier who can be found asleep on any of their plush, overstuffed sofas.


"We are lucky we all live in a time when we can do this," Durham says, referring to their life together. "I've had a very interesting journey. I've been blessed." ❖

After years of doling out decorating advice without pay, Lisa Puchalla, mother of three, decided it was time to turn her passion into a calling. She took courses at the Corcoran School of Design and hung her shingle in 2007. Her Chevy Chase firm, Lily Mae Design (named for her two daughters) has been thriving ever since. "I grew up here so I have a big network of people who know me," she explains. "Most of my clients are referrals."

Puchalla's goal is to integrate her clients' lifestyles and personalities into timeless spaces. "I can tell just by walking into a house what people are going to want to do," she comments. "I bring all the parts together based on the information I get from talking to clients and observing them." She tries to make the process fun and collaborative with a laid-back approach and "the understanding that these are people's homes—not mine.

"I want the spaces to last," she continues, "and for clients to be happy in them for the next 20 years."

CHRISTOPHER BOUTLIER


After earning a finance degree and working briefly in the corporate world, Christopher Boutlier was ready for a change. So he took a year off to renovate his condo. "I started with the bathroom, which turned out to be a nightmare," he recalls. The frustrated homeowner enrolled in a drafting class so he could sketch out ideas for his contractor—and the rest is history.


"I loved it," says Boutlier. "By the end of the semester, I had enrolled in GW's interior design school." During the three-year MFA program, he landed an internship with one of his professors, DC-based designer Lisa Adams, which led to a full-time job. "Lisa is an amazing person and taught me a lot," he says.

Now principal of his own firm, Boutlier distills what he calls "the tools of design" and applies them to each client's unique requirements. "I'm constantly challenged to move outside my comfort zone," he explains, "but in the end, it's so worth it. There's a real sense of accomplishment when a project is done and the owners are happy."

After earning a master's degree in interior design at Marymount University, Christine Philp hit a "pivotal moment" in her career when she landed a job with acclaimed Washington designer Thomas Pheasant. Philp spent five years learning the ropes of the business under Pheasant's wing (no pun intended)—an experience she values to this day.

"Being able to work around Tom taught me that you can find inspiration in anything," she explains. "But along with the creative side, I learned that interior design is not just about furniture and fabrics. Execution and project management are also very important. So much goes on behind the scenes to make a project excellent."

At the helm of her own firm since 2011, Philp says her highest priority is to encourage clients to find their own vision. "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder," she explains. "My job is to help clients figure that out. I try to see the world through their eyes and once I understand what's important to them, we can make those things a reality."

Rachel James's decorating career took a different turn in 2006 when she first appeared as a featured guest designer on HGTV's popular show "Kidspace," which focused on children's room makeovers. Before launching her own firm in 2003, James worked as a guidance counselor for students in all grade levels—a background the producers loved.

"My training on the show really got me into design," says James. "The staff and I did virtually everything, from painting murals on the walls to sewing custom window treatments to construction. It was like being on the front lines."

She has since continued to apply her skills and further build her boutique interior design firm, taking on a wide variety of jobs over the years. James, who holds a minor in art history, is equally content—and comfortable—doing contemporary, transitional or traditional projects. And her laid-back attitude immediately makes clients feel at ease. As she says, "I'm more interested in helping clients develop the very best of their own look, rather than putting my stamp on their style."


"I enjoy working with clients to make spaces feel like home," says Shawna Underwood, principal of Shawna Underwood Interior Design. "I want to make their vision into reality."




esigner David Mitchell recently planted 115 daylilies, 25 dahlias and 16 hydrangeas in his backyard—every one in white to offset the other plants in his garden, which are all lime green. He also grows beets, heirloom tomatoes, eggplant and Russian black watermelon. "Remember the old green color people used to paint shutters, that Southern green?" he comments when asked about the melons. "They're that color."

Even in his garden, Mitchell leaves nothing to chance.

From his front porch to the interiors of the 1930s Colonial he recently renovated in DC's Shepherd Park, the designer has masterfully manipulated color, texture and scale to create bold, graphic spaces. Envisioned as a "guy's house" for the "designer who would rather be kayaking than buying antiques on a Saturday," Mitchell's home celebrates the outdoors in shades of olive and khaki. But aside from the occasional

Mitchell was drawn to the home for its beautiful proportions and mint condition. "I liked the fact that it was from the 1930s—I like '30s stuff. And I was going to be the second owner. No one had messed it up with stuff I was going to have to rip out," he explains.

As soon as he purchased it, Mitchell embarked on an update that respected the home's original vernacular. Other than a single wall that he demolished to make way for a larger master bath on the second floor, the designer left the existing floor plan intact. On ground level, he introduced a modern vocabulary by raising the height of the doorways between rooms by 16 inches and updating the fireplace in the living room with a clean-lined marble surround. He ripped out the old wall-to-wall carpet, exposing original hardwood floors, and completed a total kitchen makeover. He also screened in a side porch, adding a beadboard ceiling and porcelain faux-wood floors to reflect the home's period style.

As the dust settled, it became clear to Mitchell that the house called for a depar-









ture from his regular oeuvre. "I'm known for doing ethereal houses with lots of blue-grays and golden colors," he says. But after testing his favorite robin's egg blue on the foyer walls, he recalls taking a step back and saying, "Well, this doesn't work.' I was trying to turn the house into something it's not.

"My house is more graphic than what we normally do. It has a Pacific Northwest feel to it," he continues, "mixed with a little bit of Southern heritage. Getting it to work together was a challenge."

In less experienced hands, rooms in the compact, 1,800-square-foot house could have wound up feeling cramped and smothering. But instead of filling his home with diminutive pieces, Mitchell tricked the eye

by selecting furniture with substance. For example, a tall walnut desk and large George Smith armchairs bring weight and balanced proportion to the living room. "People are afraid of big things in a small space. But they work really well," the designer observes. "You just have fewer of them."

Nature plays a starring role in the décor of this home located a stone's throw from Rock Creek Park. In the living room, framed photographs hung in a grid pattern depict birds, deer and landscapes—"all things I love about my neighborhood," Mitchell says. Rather than artwork flanking the fireplace, ledges are reserved for seasonal displays of tree branches, hydrangea or pussy willows, which the designer arranges in mammoth vases.





"They bring a green element into the room," he says, "and flowers or branches become part of the color scheme."

The palette of brown, ivory and green offers a bold contrast to Mitchell's well-honed collections, which include antiques, fine-art photography, creamware and ceramics. "I look for paint to be a backdrop," he explains. "A lot of people are obsessed with matching paint; I think paint is something you should play with a little more."

The author of his own no-holds-barred blog, "David Mitchell Uncensored," he is never one to take his work too seriously—especially in his own home. Mitchell happily admits to pairing rarefied antiques and designer pieces with affordable flea market and retail finds. "I love high-low stuff. In my living room, I have a pair of original André Arbus chairs and I also have a West Elm rug."

Mitchell is as proud of the priceless still-life photograph of a bay leaf plant in his bedroom as he is of the oversized marine blueprints covering one of the walls in his second-level TV room, which doubles as a guest room. Each one, printed in orange reverse, cost \$15. "I design this way," he says of the mix. "I think it's what makes design so interesting nowadays."

He is also a master at combining disparate and unexpected objects. In his home you'll find étagères and a coffee table from his own collection for Salvations Architectural Furnishings; stone-glazed Chinese stools; African bone bracelets arranged as a dining room centerpiece; and in the kitchen, a curved metal table on wheels that began life in a Victorian animal hospital.


In Mitchell's kitchen, color gives way to a calming palette. Pale gray cabinetry and slabs of marble on the counters and walls create a timeless, classic vibe.

The room will change next year, when an addition will enlarge the kitchen and convert the screened porch into a new TV room, making way for a dedicated guest room upstairs. Mitchell will also build a deck. "As much as I'm into gardening, a little less green space is fine with me," he admits. "This spring I did find genetically engineered grass that only grows three inches tall. We'll see if it works.

"I love learning stuff," he reflects. "There's always something new to learn." ❖


leanor Niermann's world is filled with memories of her parents' boundless talent for creating beautiful furnishings. The Maryland company they founded in 1978-maker of elegant, handcrafted furniture, lighting and accessories sold to the trade only-has literally formed the fabric of her life. As a teenager, she acid-washed metal beads to create a patina for the Niermann Weeks Iron & Crystal Chandelier, deemed an "iconic 1970s design" 30 years later by Interior Design. When successive models of Joe Niermann's first coffee table sold to designers right out of the family's living room, she noted its changing dimensions because she had to adjust her position while watching TV. In fact, observing her father parlay his knowledge of antique restoration into the creation of new pieces for their growing furnishings business helped mold who she is today. Small wonder Eleanor has furnished the Eastport house she built across Spa Creek from Annapolis with so many beautiful prototypes from her life and family business.

"See my model of a 17th-century Southern Maryland brick manor house under the console in the study?" Niermann asks during a

tour of her 3,100-square-foot, two-bedroom frame house. "I loved the ornamental brickwork so I built a model of it for a high school project." Her father's artwork hangs above the Frascati Console, which her mother and sister also own in different finishes. "My sister Claire and I helped my father create the Palissy Lantern," Eleanor says, pointing to one hanging above a velvet-draped center table. "Claire has since designed a Palissy fixture for low ceilings as a result of living in a 1960s rancher. Traditionally, Niermann Weeks's best designs originate from the ideas we get furnishing our own homes."

Eleanor Niermann, half of the sister team now directing Niermann Weeks in Millersville, Maryland, took over a share of her mother, Eleanor McKay's, marketing duties and her father's design tasks in 2012 when they retired from the company. The fact that she had completed her own house in 2009 was a boon, as her new responsibilities send her to showrooms across the country promoting collections. When she returned home following the recent New York launch of designer Amanda Nisbet's collaboration with Niermann Weeks, she was grateful for the refuge of her own personal oasis.

"I've actually lived in Eastport since 1996, so I've experienced how relaxed this sailors' destination is across the drawbridge from the Annapolis Yacht Club," she says. "I built my house because a lot came up for sale that promised unusual privacy."

Despite her love of the laid-back, water-oriented lifestyle, Niermann drew from the formal symmetry of Annapolis's 18th-century architecture when she and her father brainstormed her home's design with Annapolis architect Gary Schwerzler. "I used a symmetrical center-hall plan with two ways out of every room," she says. "I took liberties with the windows, bringing them all the way to the floor to get as much light in the house as possible." She created modern contrast in the interior architecture with a staircase that fills the rear center hall with a luscious curve. "It's made of steel with drywall and spackle filling in the base," she says. "People seeing the house always comment on how contemporary the inside feels."

Niermann's choice of stark white walls and lightly bleached wide-plank pine flooring provides a neutral backdrop, or "canvas," as she thinks of it, for her treasure trove of furnishings. "It's second nature for me to stage my things because I do all the showroom displays for Niermann Weeks," she observes. "But sometimes I think of my house as an excuse to gather furnishings I admire."

The practice of assessing and promoting furnishings for their beauty originates with her father. "Dad can take a classic antique and hone it to an essential shape for a new piece that is exactly right for today's living," Niermann says. "My sister and I like to think we're carrying on his talent."

Niermann mixes periods and styles, combining antiques with more contemporary furnishings and pieces from prominent designers. In the living room, Amanda Nisbet's Pike Occasional Table and Niermann's own sunburst design for a fire screen make a bold contrast with the Niermann Weeks Tramezzo Screens, inspired by ancient Rome, in the windows. The frisson between worlds is exactly

what she's after and it may be that extra element she and her sister encourage with their new generation of the company's offerings.

"I'm not into layering," Niermann says. "I like making a statement." For example, two Petunia Pendants from Amanda Nisbet's spring collection deliver task lighting over a kitchen table/workspace. But with their funky, blue serrated petals and gold-leaf interiors, they slant the straightforward kitchen in a more personal and eccentric direction.

Though color has real presence in Niermann's rooms, she tends to use it sparingly. The pink velvet-draped table in her study, for example, is there for sentimental reasons: "It's the same one from the living room of a Beaux Arts house my parents rehabbed in Memphis when they were just starting their business," she says. Her favorite celadon paint finish, most noticeable on the dining room chairs, floats through the house as verdigris furniture finishes, or on upholstery fabrics and ceramics. The color pay-off comes on the floor of the living room at the back of the house: Vibrant orange hues in a large antique Oushak rug explode in an intense complement to the room's calming blues.

Creating beautiful furnishings for the home is a business for Niermann. But in her own home, it's also a compulsion and a pleasure. Trained from childhood with a discerning eye, she wouldn't have it any other way. ❖

ori Graham's 14th Street shop, Lori Graham Home, perfectly exemplifies the designer's chic, eclectic sensibility. A trip to her home, therefore, comes as no surprise. It exudes the same hip, glamorous vibe, created by the deft juxtaposition of dynamic art, vintage finds and strong, warm colors. The two-bedroom row house was a recent purchase for Graham. After completing several major row-house projects close to downtown DC's 14th Street Corridor, she had become a fan of the ar-

ea's surrounding residential streets. Newly single, she was looking for a fresh start for herself and her beloved Papillons, Camus and MiltonFriedman, when the bottom two floors of a late Victorianera row house on Corcoran Street became available. Graham was thrilled—especially when she went inside. "I was attracted by the architecture," she says. "I loved the fireplace, the open floor plan, the high ceilings and the exposed brick in the back."

The first floor, with its II-and-a-half-foot ceilings, encompasses living and dining rooms, a powder room behind the stairs, a small but functional kitchen—already updated when Graham moved in—and a breakfast nook that she converted into a sitting room. Bay windows at both the front and back of the house bring in light, and oak floors were conveniently stained dark (one of Graham's signatures) before she bought the house.

The lower level, which the designer describes as an English, or above-ground, basement, boasts plenty of light, with full-height windows and nine-foot ceilings. It houses a home office-cum-guest room and a master bedroom and bath. The lower level opens out to both front and back gardens.

Graham set to work first figuring out how to create more storage space. "I needed places for books, objects and serving ware," she says. In the living room, she flanked the etched-stone fireplace with open shelving on one side and a built-in, ceiling-height mirror on the other that makes the room feel larger. In the dining room, there were niches on either side of a blank wall (on the other side of which is the neighbors' fireplace). "They cried out for built-ins," says the


designer, who particularly needed storage space in the dining room that would accommodate overflow from the small kitchen.

To create the sophisticated, glam look she wanted, Graham decorated the house with reupholstered vintage furniture and pieces selected from her showroom. In the dining room, for example, the table came from her shop, while "the chairs are pieces I've had forever," she says. Above the dining room table, a new chandelier by CL Sterling & Son conveys the look of an earlier era with its use of mercury glass.


In the living room, with its soft gray palette, mid-century sofas share space with a glass-topped coffee table from the showroom; a high-backed chair by the window—a popular perch for the dogs—is a vintage piece that's been reupholstered in Italian velvet by C&C Milano. An unusual beaded chandelier from Shine by S.H.O., a home furnishings line carried by Lori Graham Home, creates a focal point above a console table by the bay window.


The living and dining rooms are more formal, but "the house becomes more casual as you move back through it," says Graham. The sitting room, painted a dark Benjamin Moore gray boasts an antique red rug from Timothy Paul Carpet + Home, a sofa from Graham's showroom, an eye-catching ram's head coffee table and Greek key chairs. The sitting and dining rooms share a wall of exposed brick that warms both spaces.

New decorative wall moldings lend visual interest, while custom draperies—navy velvet in the living room and white denim by Powell & Bonnell trimmed with a lively Ikat pattern in the sitting room—accent the big bay windows and high ceilings.


For Graham, her choice of art was very important. She turned to colleague and curator Mike Johnson for some pieces, selecting a mix of vintage Japanese lithographs, art photography and personal photographs for a collage of art in the living room. Above the mantel, an abstract canvas by Robert Mellor introduces a vivid shot of color to the room, while in the sitting room, photographs by Barbara Probst are striking against the dark-hued wall. On an easel behind the sofa, an oil painting by Teo González adds a punch of color.

Downstairs, Graham enjoyed creating a thoroughly "girly" bedroom, complete with floor-to-ceiling pink draperies and soft, feminine bedding. "It was fun because I got to do it by myself," she says.

A DC native, Graham has lived in the capital her whole life. "I used to be a lawyer before I made the switch to interior design," she says. This year marks her tenth anniversary as a designer, and her second since the opening of her showroom, only a block and a half away. Now, her new home heralds another beginning. "It's a great location," she says. "It's the perfect size and the perfect fit."

Easy Rhythm

Designer Michael Roberson celebrates the change of seasons in her airy Arlington home

fter earning a degree in interior design, Michael Roberson spent 18 years creating window displays for Neiman Marcus in her native Texas and, later, her adopted hometown of Washington, DC. The experience not only taught her how to execute projects on time, but also how to infuse them with a sense of drama—a skill that still comes in handy today as she runs her own interior design firm.

Roberson's studio occupies a light-filled wing in the Arlington home where she and her husband Rob, a retired technology management consultant, raised their son and now entertain three grandchildren. Just as she does for her clients, Roberson has distilled a fresh, clean-lined look in her home that captures her style in a carefree, seemingly effortless way.

The house and surrounding landscape have evolved over the years with the couple's lifestyle and aesthetic. "Houses should be like peo-

ple and families, and have generations," says Roberson, referring to the mix of contemporary and antique furnishings and art that prevails throughout her interiors. "You don't want it all modern—you want to mix things up. But most of all, it has to be comfortable."

Between the enveloping forest of Donghia botanical wallpaper and the designer's disarming Southern charm, visitors immediately feel welcome upon arrival in her foyer. There, a framed serigraph of a doll's face "gives some people the creeps," Roberson admits, "but I love it."

She contends that her sizable art collection "varies hugely, but there's always a rhythm to what appeals to me. Because I was an art student for so long, I respond to composition—but at the same time, I'm very intrigued by the lack of structure." In the living room, French etchings and a Fritz Scholder work share space with a piece by Washington Color School artist Gene Davis. Beneath the latter, a modern, armless sofa of Roberson's design is paired with an antique armchair that belonged to her grandmother and a coffee table made from a vintage Japanese hibachi.

"If anybody's eclectic, I am," says Roberson. "But I can truly say that everything I have, I love."

Beyond the living room, a modern addition completed seven years ago enlarged and updated the kitchen and dining room and forged a stronger connection between the home and its lush backyard. Roberson, who enjoys "cooking and feeding people," turned to architect Charles Moore to design the renovation, which would also include a bold staircase and a screened porch. Moore bumped out the entire rear of the home. On the main level, the new dining room is framed by a wall of windows and French doors that spill onto a balcony.

A long dining table allows Roberson to seat up to 20 for family dinners. A carefully designed lighting plan combines pendants and recessed lights to illuminate the tabletop without casting harsh light on diners. "It's important to light the table and the perimeter," says the designer. "You can see what you're eating and everybody looks beautiful."

Roberson designed her dream kitchen in space that once housed the kitchen and dining room combined. A picture of efficiency with marble countertops and easy-on-the-feet cork floors, it features enough cabinet space to store dishes and barware within easy reach, an 18-foot-long island that accommodates food prep and

buffet meals, a six-burner Dacor range and an eat-in breakfast area. Roberson is so delighted with her new kitchen that she calls it her "playroom."

A seating area for two between the dining room and the vaulted staircase is the owners' favorite spot to read the morning paper or enjoy an evening aperitif. "We spend a lot of time right in this little corner," says Roberson. "We call it the tower; it's really magical."

Though the designer happily entertains parties large and small in the sun-dappled addition, she also enjoys the interplay of light and shadow throughout her home. "I'm not afraid of a dark space," she says, pointing out the library off the foyer painted in Duron's Sealskin brown. "We turn a lamp on in there and it's this cozy little safe place. And the living room is fairly dim. In the summertime, it's so comforting to have that."

The warmer months are also prime time to enjoy the lower-level screened porch, where two Niermann Weeks chaises with luxuri-

ous cushions beckon. "I sit out here in the summer and read for hours," says Roberson. The screened porch opens to the family room, which was also revamped during the renovation. This cozy hangout is furnished with clean-lined furniture, folk art Roberson has collected around the world—including several Hokkaido bear sculptures—and a wall of bookshelves built by her husband.

Throughout her home, neutral colors derived from nature create a calm backdrop that offsets Roberson's bolder art and accessories. She advises clients not to underestimate the power of a neutral palette. "People talk about natural colors being boring, but they're not," she insists. "I tend to think that my favorite colors—the greens and gray-browns and blue-grays—are the colors of nature. I think that, subconsciously, they anchor us in some way."

Though she is thrilled with her updated house, Roberson is probably most content in her impeccably manicured garden. She nurtures her flower beds all spring and summer and often enjoys lunch under the shade of a favorite crape myrtle.

"Gardening occupies your mind without causing any stress," she says. "It's like painting with living things. I love that sense of quiet when you're outside. When I come home and get out in the yard, it's like a mini vacation." •








he 2014 DC Design House transformed a classic but dated 8,000-square-foot, stone center-hall Colonial located in Northwest DC's picturesque Forest Hills neighborhood. The house and grounds showcased the work of 27 area design teams whose innovative ideas and creative execution imparted 21st-century style to the traditional 1929 home. Sponsored in part by *Home & Design* and C2 Paint, the show house was open for tours from April 13 through May 11; in case you missed it, we highlight each room on the following pages. Now in its seventh year, the DC Design House benefits Children's National Health System.

First Impression Architect David Benton and his team offset the home's traditional front façade by "brightening it up and making it friendlier and more approachable," he says. The French entry doors were painted vibrant Pond Shimmer blue, and new shutters now match the existing ones. A glass door in the vestibule admits light into the foyer while accessories, including planters and a bench, create an arrival space outside. Design: David A. Benton, AIA, LEED Green Associate, Rill Architects, PC.



Making an Entrance

According to Camille Saum, the foyer and stairwell (above) were in need of "a bit of drama and timeless design." She and her associate, Whitney Hansen, achieved this goal by extending glitzy, beaded wall-paper by Romo up to the third floor, and painting ceilings in high-gloss Viburnum from Barry Dixon's The Naturals collection for C2 Paint. Plywood floors were painted in a large-scale checkerboard pattern and art from Merritt Gallery added bursts of color on every level. *Design: Camille Saum, ASID, Camille Saum Interior Design, LLC*.



Family Affair

Victoria Sanchez created a comfortable, welcoming seating area in the relatively narrow space (right) abutting the kitchen, ensuring that it would complement both the kitchen and adjoining butler's pantry. She took her cues from the palette of wood and cream in the kitchen, installing a sectional sofa that emphasized the L-shaped walls of windows to "wrap around the space" and bring the outdoors in. Stylish furnishings and accessories were sourced from the designer's Old Town Alexandria boutique, Victoria at Home. Design: Victoria Sanchez, ASID, IFDA, Victoria at Home, LLC.









New Traditional

The scope of the work was the biggest challenge Nadia Subaran faced during her kitchen redesign (left)—which included the removal of a large masonry wall that separated it from the sitting room. She paired Wood-Mode burnishedcherry cabinetry with soapstone countertops and a seamless, marble-like porcelain-tile backsplash. Porcelain tile floors resembled fieldstone. "I call it a 'new traditional' look," says Subaran. "It has texture and warmth with minimal detailing." Design: Nadia N. Subaran, Aidan Design.



A Modern Twist

In his re-do of the library (above), Nestor Santa-Cruz was inspired by its 1970s paneling, which reminded him of rooms designed by Jean-Michel Frank in the late '20s. With their look of cerused oak, the panels provided a backdrop for a space that blended classical and modern Scandinavian elements. "Modern design is not about a particular period," Santa-Cruz says. Beneath an abstract painting from Susan Calloway Fine Arts, a Hans Wegner sofa shared space with antique Louis XVI chairs. Design: Nestor Santa-Cruz, IIDA, Nestor Santa-Cruz Decoration.



Martini, Anyone?

Coordinating with the adjoining library, Tracy Morris conceived the diminutive library bar (left) as "a throwback to an era" when enjoying cocktails in a private niche was in vogue. She left the room's existing bar with its retro stainless-steel sink and countertop intact, but installed a limestone backsplash wall in a faux wood grain. An unlacquered brass Waterworks faucet, art from Susan Calloway Fine Arts and a mirror from Donghia completed the picture. Design: Tracy Morris, Tracy Morris Design, LLC.



Lounge Around

"Tone on Tone" was the theme for the family room (left), according to Jeff Akseizer and Jamie Brown. The designers achieved a soothing vibe using textured wallpaper from Thibaut that evoked bleached wood and subtle window treatments by Romo. A custom sofa and a coffee table by Berman Rosetti faced a media wall that included shelving, a TV and a linear gas fireplace. The room opens out to the pool area through French doors that admit plenty of light. Design: Jeff Akseizer & Jamie Brown, Akseizer Design Group, LLC.

Made in the Shade

Tapped to dress up the pool area (below), the designers decided to make it "an extension of the family room," Naseera Moore-Lawrence says. "We chose teak furniture because it is really high quality." They employed seating arrangements that included the Havana club chairs, sofa and ottoman; Fiori coffee tables; and the Seneca dining table. Chaises and director's chairs flanked the pool, while vibrant cushions and umbrellas in durable Sunbrella fabrics added the finishing touch. Fresh Style

When Joanne Fitzgerald embarked on a redesign of the dull, cramped powder room (above), she wanted it to be "the antithesis of what it was." To inject a sense of drama without overpowering the space, she balanced an accent wall covered in a rich, shimmery peacock-themed wallpaper by Cole & Sons against a backsplash wall of iridescent stone, glass and metal tiles. A narrow Kohler Saile commode fit the space while a floating acrylic sink top kept the room light. Design: Joanne Fitzgerald, Gatéga Interior Design, LLC.



Back to Nature

To unify the jumbled backyard, Stephen Wlodarczyk designed a custom pergola that extends above the backyard patio (above). Steps curved up to the grassy lawn, while a gravel sitting area was anchored by glazed urns that echo the colors of the changing room inside. "To integrate the house with the yard," Wlodarczyk coordinated with Christopher Cahill to build a centrally located door to the nearby pool dressing room. Stately Approach

When designing the entry garden (right), Gina Benincasa took her cues from the style of the house. "Our vision was to create a stately, traditional threshold that would match the home's stature," she says. Stonework and mature, manicured plantings created a classic feel while adding color and interest. A number of the existing plants were retained and revitalized in particular, a decades-old heirloom azalea of sentimental value to the owners. Child's Play Intent on creating "a fun playroom for kids to engage without technology," Katherine Vernot-Jonas filled the space with options for indoor physical activity—including a climbing wall, climbing ropes and hanging rings. Built-ins lined one side of the room, with space for storage and display and a cushioned window seat. A bold palette of primary colors was intended to stimulate creativity, while brightly hued rugs and furniture ensured a playful atmosphere. Art Deco Splash

A reclaimed shower door with a South Beach, Miami, motif provided the inspiration for the Art Deco loggia and pool bath/dressing room (left). Christopher Cahill and Kerry Ann Rodriguez framed and back-lit the door and hung it in the dressing room, borrowing its vibrant colors for the loggia. "We wanted it to feel retro," Cahill explains. Hand-cut vinyl floor tiles arranged in a Deco pattern and fish tile from Italo Ceramica in the adjoining bath (inset) reinforced the look. 
A Step Forward

The design team combined bold paint colors with a panel of lively Thibaut fabric in shades of plum, lilac and spring green to lure visitors into taking the back stairs (above). "We wanted to use Radiant Orchid—Pantone's Color of the Year," says Teri Lohmann of the textured, paintable wallpaper they chose from York Wallcoverings to camouflage cracks in the home's original plaster walls. Bathing Beauty

Nancy Colbert reconfigured the master bedroom (right), where a wall had been moved between the bedroom and bath to allow more bath and closet space. "The wallpaper was our inspiration," says Susan Donelson of the delicate Thibaut floral pattern that covered the walls of the first guest room, located on the second floor (opposite, top). In the upstairs sitting room (right), the designers used the movement and reflective color of water to convey a sense of relaxation. 
Retro Look

Francie Hester's art on metal reflects the ravages of time

he concept of beauty is difficult," says Francie Hester, standing beside one of the ravishing new art objects displayed recently in an exhibition of her work at Kaller Fine Arts in Washington, DC. "A lot of beauty comes out of destruction."

For the past decade and a half, from her studio on an industrial byway in Kensington, Hester has been attacking metal with hammers, drills, sandpaper, routers and a blowtorch. Tearing down the surface, she builds it back up, then repeats the process layer by layer, often drop by drop. This laborious technique mirrors ideas at the heart of her work—the passage of time and its ravages, the hard-earned beauty that comes from experiencing life's turbulence.


"You can't have joy without pain, highs without lows, life without death," Hester says philosophically. In her art, light and shadows coexist peaceably. She points to

one example, "Relic #4." The free-standing disk is covered in brilliantly mottled blue shades as indefinable as the colors on peacock feathers.

"Everybody knows what a pretty blue looks like," says the artist. "But that's a little ordinary." To deconstruct it, she added contrasting rust tones. Wherever Hester detects a particularly beautiful passage of color, she feels compelled to counter it with a dark place. "It may be buried in the piece," she notes, "not seen on the surface."

Hester likes creating new buried treasures and rediscovering old ones. Her Relic series is based on artifacts unearthed in Chinese burial sites—simplified, enlarged and embedded with new meaning. She begins by roughing up the smooth surface of 29-inch-diameter aluminum disks as they arrive from a fabricator in Minnesota. She adds and subtracts acrylic paints and inks,

and sometimes simply water, using squeegees, rubber spatulas, a fork, eyedroppers or whatever is called into play.

Subtly blended colors emerge from beneath encrusted layers, suggesting the erosion of age. Within a perfect circle, radiating borders imply "the continuity of life and death, and the infinity of time," says the artist. By contrast, in her Convex series, circles are divided into separate segments. Each section is spaced out on the wall and further subdivided into well-defined patterns. These pieces signify a different rhythm—a break in the action.

"There are events in life when we stop and start. And there are times when life is fluid, when things happen in waves," Hester reflects, tracing at the same time her own life trajectory. Arriving in Washington in the late 1980s, Hester had a lofty downtown studio on the top floor of the then low-rent Lansburgh Building. She earned a master's degree in art theory from the University of Maryland, and by 2000, her painting had moved from canvas to wavy aluminum panels with a honeycomb core. Then 9/11 hit.

After that momentous day, she recalls thinking, "I can't just paint what I was painting.' I had to stop and start again." The everyday imagery in her work vanished. Seeking a spiritual connection, she listened to the pure, extended notes of Gregorian chants. She remembers, "I would hear an absolutely gorgeous passage, then sand away a portion of the paint and build again. I realized then that there was beauty in shadows." She called that first series Strata—Italian for "layers."

Subsequent losses triggered further reflection and change. In 2004 and 2010, beloved friends tragically died—journalist and editor Diane Granat Yalowitz, age 49; and Brendan Ogg, a 19-year-old college sophomore, poet and best friend of Hester's son. In an elegiac tribute, Hester and her studio partner, artist Lisa Hill, brought family and friends together for a communal arts project. All performed a simple task: wrapping cutout paper around paper clips. Each piece bore words scanned from magazine stories by Yalowitz or poems by Ogg.

Some 80,000 paperclips were wrapped. Linked together, they form studded

streams grouped into 16-foot-long cascades. Part of the billowing testament, "Wordfall," is now on view with other works by Hester at the Athenaeum in Alexandria. It is one of five exhibits of Hester's work to open from March to June in Washington and New York. The shows represent the result of two years of intense work.

Hester talks a lot about "circling back" in her art, as she has done by revisiting her early Strata series. Starting out with a single theme in mind, she lines up several pieces and paints all with the same grid or swirls. Then the paths of each diverge. "It's almost like writing a novel. You know all the people, but not how they'll inter-

act," says the artist. "There's an evolution that happens." To decide when a piece is complete, Hester may take it home and live with it. "It has to offer something different each time I look at it," she adds with the renewed pleasure of discovery. *

rancisca Villarroel Alonso and Antonio Alonso both hail from Spain—but they met while studying architecture at Catholic University. After graduating, they married and pursued separate careers, then ended up pooling their talent in 2001 when they founded AV Architects, pllc. Within a couple of years, however, they realized they wanted more control over their designs in the construction phase of each project. At that point, they launched AV Architects + Builders - a full-scale renovation and custom-home construction company with architects and builders under one roof. "There are a lot of design/build companies," Francisca points out, "but very few are headed by architects rather than builders. We have created an unusual niche."

The Alonsos see many benefits to the way their firm does business. Among them is the sense that having an architect in the field


during the building phase adds another level of value for the client. "We control costs during design and protect the design during construction," Francisca explains. Adds Tony, "No one understands the design better than the designer. We're the ones who can make necessary changes during construction without compromising the design's intent."

Over the years, AV Architects + Builders has developed a style of its own, rooted in the traditional European vernacular each partner experienced while growing up in Spain. "It's a hybrid of traditional and modern. We use traditional materials like wood and stone that are warm and appealing, but add a modern touch in terms of design," Francisca explains. "We offer modern floor plans that are in alignment with the lifestyles of our clients." Open layouts, clean lines and lots of glass characterize the interiors of projects by AV Architects.

An example of this aesthetic is currently represented by a soon-to-be-completed spec home in McLean, Virginia, the couple has dubbed the "360 Home." The idea was hatched after the Alonsos had completed numerous renovations in which they had to "solve the problems of traditional homes." These included layouts in which there was unused space in the house, poor flow, an under-utilized yard and more. "Francisca had a list of the top 20 issues we needed to solve," says Tony. "So we created a design that would address them."

Measuring more than 10,000 square feet, with 2,000 square feet of pre-designed outdoor space, the 360 Home boasts an open-plan layout. Staircases are located at the ends of the house instead of in the middle to eliminate dead space, and only three doors—two to the bathrooms and one to the library—separate the ground-floor spaces from one another. The airy design emphasizes easy living, both for family and entertaining purposes; a functional, casual vibe; a seamless flow to a host of outdoor spaces that include balconies, patios, a grotto and a pool; natural materials like stone, wood, metal and glass; a low-voltage LED lighting system; and Control 4 home automation.

The 360 Home is a prototype; buyers can choose from other, similar designs. The house is currently on the market for \$3.5 million.

preserving history



he stately, neoclassical National Academy of Sciences building in DC has been revitalized. Designed in 1922 by Bertram Grosvenor Goodhue, it was added onto in 1965 and 1970 but had remained untouched since.

Tapped to renovate this landmark, Quinn Evans Architects restored its historic envelope, overhauled outdated mechanical systems and implemented sustainable technologies. "We reconfigured it to create more public spaces," says project manager Thomas Jester. "We made courtyards into atriums and restored gallery space for the Academy's art collection."

In the great hall (left), decades of dirt and smoke were removed from the dome, which was originally fauxpainted and gilded in the '20s by muralist Hildreth Meiere. LED lights now illuminate the space and wood surfaces have been reiuvenated.

The restoration received an award of excellence from the AIA's Northern Virginia chapter and a 2013 District of Columbia award for Excellence in Historic Preservation. —Julie Sanders
