

# ROOMS we love?



















Georgetown Victorian beckoned to a family of six. But its interiors were woefully outdated and impractical, so the owners called on interior designer Marika Meyer for an update that would make the house more functional for family living, with public spaces such as the living room conveying a sense of graciousness and sophistication for large-scale entertaining.

Separated from an adjoining parlor by pocket doors, the redesigned living room boasts such distinctive features as the original, marble-clad fireplace and a turret. Meyer enhanced the room's elegance with additional millwork, then installed built-in bookshelves. "The owners are big readers," she observes. "The bookshelves add a personal dimension and a casual vibe."

In its previous iteration, the living room had a convoluted furniture plan with too many tables and limited seating. Meyer incorporated a baby grand piano in the turret and repurposed a crystal chandelier from the dining room above it. Existing sofas and a glass-topped coffee table were re-oriented to create a more functional layout. An antique French commode and mirror and an occasional chair by Victoria Hagan, upholstered in vibrant blue, add interest. Niermann Weeks floor lamps anchor the sofas and a Tibetan rug layered over a thinly woven sisal creates texture.

A Restoration Hardware console is paired with a series of graphic prints from Natural Curiosities, while above the fireplace, an original painting by Wolf Kahn creates a focal point. Meyer eschewed window treatments in favor of the existing shutters. "This way," she says, "we kept the space open and airy."

Then redesigning a Bethesda home for a couple who love to entertain, Andrew Law envisioned an elegant dining room where guests could linger with comfortable seating, plenty of space and a warm, welcoming feel.

To achieve his goal, Law first created a connection between the dining room and nearby library that encourages guests to congregate in both. To do this, he commissioned the installation of millwork in the library that duplicates the existing wainscoting in the dining room. Made of quarter-sawn oak, the new millwork has a distinctive grain that decorative paint studio Billet Collins then matched with a faux-bois finish on the dining room's wainscoting and crown molding. Handblocked wallpaper by Rose Tarlow picks up what Law calls "putty with crimson accents" in the faux finish and "creates warmth and depth in the room."

The designer furnished the dining room with clean-lined, traditional pieces. A Bausman & Company dining table is paired with British Khaki dining chairs and reproduction Chippendale end chairs in Chinese red leather from Rose Tarlow. A sofa by Edward Ferrell + Lewis Mittman and a wing chair by Victoria Hagan allow "guests to finish dinner and linger," says Law. Twin iron consoles by Salvations Architectural Furnishings are topped with limestone; they complement the hand-stitched iron-and-vellum sconces and chandelier by Roman Thomas. Putty-colored silk-and-linen draperies warm the room and a pale blue-painted ceiling offsets its warmth. Architectural photographs above the consoles, taken on a trip to Prague by the homeowner, sound a more personal, contemporary note.

omeowners in Avenel wished to update their 15-year-old house and contacted designer Kristin Peake for the job. To overhaul the builder-grade kitchen, Peake tapped Hedy Shashaani of Jack Rosen Custom Kitchens to design a fresh, transitional space that would reflect the home's aesthetic while imparting new levels of quality and functionality.

The original layout was problematic, with one large, angular island that held the cooktop, downdraft hood and sink. The size and location of the island impeded traffic flow, and the walk-in pantry was awkwardly situated. "We created flow by breaking up the island into two," Shashaani explains. "Now each island has its own purpose." One is for food prep and the other—with seating for five and a wine cooler—is for entertaining; located by the breakfast area, it also serves as a buffet. The walk-in pantry was replaced with a wall of easy-access pantry cupboards.

Shashaani relocated the cooktop (a 36-inch Wolf Pro Series range) to the far wall. The new range is paired with a custom hood in contrasting finishes that measures over seven feet wide, creating an attractive focal point. "A lot of houses have downdraft ventilation, but it's rarely sufficient," Shashaani comments.

The peripheral cabinetry, by Elmwood, is painted in Warm Concrete with Oyster glaze, while the furniture-like islands are stained in Driftwood. Dishware is stored in a hutch with antiqued-mirror doors near the breakfast area. The countertops and backsplash are made of honed Calcutta Gold marble.

couple with three young children and a correspondingly hectic lifestyle were looking to remodel their Alexandria home one room at a time. They hired Paola McDonald of Olamar Interiors for the job, which started with the master bedroom. "Ultimately, the bedroom felt like a priority because of their busy lives," McDonald says. "They asked me to turn it into a retreat where they could rest and recharge."

The wife also requested a "coastal" vibe for the space. "She wanted it to have a beachy feel, but without being beachthemed," explains McDonald. "I used colors, textures and materials to evoke the experience of being at the beach."

The large bedroom needed a focal point, so McDonald created an accent wall covered in large-format wallpaper from Thibaut, then placed the couple's Restoration Hardware bedstead, with its imposing upholstered headboard, against it. The wallpaper, in shades of cool blue and earthy brown, conveys that coastal sensibility; custom linen Roman shades emphasize the brown while surrounding walls painted Benjamin Moore's Constellation pick up the restful blue hue.

McDonald used the elaborate tray ceiling to add interest to the room. She painted the moldings and sloped surfaces crisp white, then covered the ceiling in sand-colored grasscloth from Thibaut. Both wallcoverings give off a metallic shimmer that imparts a layer of sophistication.

A rope-and-bronze chandelier, blue-glass bedside lamps and a bronze-framed floor mirror—all from Uttermost—complete the picture. Rustic night tables and a tufted bench are from Caracole.

A fter 16 years of living with a circa-1970s master bath in her Potomac, Maryland, home, Deborah Kalkstein—owner of Contemporaria in DC's Cady's Alley—was ready for a fresh, modern overhaul that would turn the dated room into an inviting, functional space.

The original bath was spacious at 12 by 18 feet; Kalkstein further opened it up by removing a wall separating the shower from the rest of the room and replacing it with a sleek, glass enclosure. "We also took out drop ceilings above the sinks to allow the mirrors to go all the way to the ceiling," the designer explains.

Kalkstein's material selections emphasized functionality and a spare, contemporary look. "I wanted everything to be easy to live with," she says. Choices include gray-tinted, poured-concrete counters and custom vessel sinks made of crisp, white Corian with fixtures installed in the walls to keep the surfaces uncluttered. The custom, wrap-around vanity is dark-stained oak with plenty of carefully considered, customized storage; for example, a series of deep drawers holds toiletry bottles standing up.

Floors and walls are clad in porcelain tile, but the large-format floor tiles are smooth while the smaller wall tiles are textured. The shower surround is marble and the luxurious sunken tub is made of white Corian.


The lighting plan was important to the design. "We used warm LED lights with different switches for lighting different areas of the room," Kalkstein says. Simple roll-up shades provide privacy while admitting natural light.

When the owners of an Annapolis home on the South River tasked designer Michelle Miller with decorating their interiors, they also asked her to outfit their outdoor living spaces in casual, easygoing style. She set out to complement the beautiful landscaping already in place with clean-lined, comfortable furniture that would make entertaining a breeze.

"We created little environments out there, just like we'd do inside," Miller explains. Her furniture plan encompassed three gathering areas on a long terrace located under the rear deck of the house, overlooking the pool and the river beyond. On one end, a large, modular sectional provides plenty of seating; plush cushions in Holly Hunt outdoor fabric combine comfort and practicality. In the center, a long dining table boasts a bench on one side to seat lots of kids. And on the far end, a pair of inviting lounge chairs with matching ottomans creates a perfectly tranquil spot for two.

Brown Jordan chaise longues around the pool invite sunbathers to linger. Custom pillows reflect the bright colors of perennials blooming on the grounds.


"My clients love the water and being outside," Miller says.
"When kids are in the pool, the adults can sit here and relax—they don't have to be on the pool deck."

Miller purposely kept the seating arrangements open so guests can view the landscape and easily navigate through the space without feeling trapped. "One of the things I try to avoid is overwhelming a space with too much furniture," she says. "There's a lot of beauty in simplicity."

In a light-filled DC condo, Douglas Burton of Apartment Zero used the client's existing green sofa "to tell the color story." Against a background of white oak floors and heather gray walls, Burton created a streamlined, modern abode with apple-green accents throughout. "Using color thoughtfully allows for visual connections to be made," Burton observes. "Pops of color create drama and give your eye room to breathe." Space was a constraint, so custom furniture was placed in functional vignettes; accessories and art create visual interest.

A Bethesda family tapped Ali Honarkar of Division1 Architects to replace their dark, 1950s-era home with a prefab abode, as money was a concern. Honarkar instead created a new house on the same footprint that answered his clients' requirements without breaking the bank.

A problematic slope required steep stairs down from the deck to access the backyard. The owners couldn't easily get outdoors from the house.

A product of its era, the house was cramped and dark, with very little natural light.

### RENEWABLE SPACE

Jim Rill designs a LEED Gold-certified home in true Arts & Crafts style

developer living in the historic area of Kensington, Maryland, called on Rill Architects to design a green home on the lot beside hers. She wished it to reflect an historic precedent—specifically the Prairie-style architecture that harkened back to her native Chicago.

Principal Jim Rill's design met the challenge of creating a sustainable home full of Craftsman-style features that make it warm and inviting. The wrap-around porch "creates a flow that brings the outdoors in," says Rill. He added a Prairie-style fieldstone fireplace in the family room flanked by built-ins and installed stained-oak millwork throughout. Details include Craftsman-style windows and light fixtures by Hubbardton Forge.

The 3,100-square-foot home boasts geothermal heat and air conditioning; Icynene spray foam insulation that creates an airtight envelope in the walls, basement, ceiling and roof; and Structural Insulated Sheathing panels that add a layer of rigid foam insulation. HardiePlank fibercement siding clads the exterior, with a roof of architectural composite shingles.

Inside, Rill and his team sourced ecofriendly building materials. The millwork is made from replenishable, FSC-certified oak; the floors are reclaimed oak salvaged from a warehouse about to be demolished. Rill selected IceStone recycled-glass countertops, bamboo kitchen cabinets and renewable cork for the basement floors. Energy Star appliances, LED and fluorescent lighting and high-performance, low-E Jeld-Wen windows complete the picture. This custom home that marries sustainability and period style was sold soon after completion.

### **TRADE SECRETS**

- When building a sustainable home, examine how the house is oriented on the lot. The way the wind and sun impact your home is very important pay attention to roof overhangs and passive solar gain.
- Utilize indoor air-circulation techniques. Air in the house should not be recycled; there should be ways to take in fresh air throughout. In this home, emphasis was placed on indoor air quality with a highly efficient HVAC system, VOC-free finishes and surfaces and sealed, direct-vent gas fireplaces.
- Have fun with your project. Don't spend just to be green; be sure to choose your building materials because they're aesthetically pleasing and economically efficient. Being green should never preclude being beautiful.








### FROM FORMAL TO FUNCTIONAL

How have trends and amenities in custom homes evolved over the last 10 years? What features are you seeing most often today?

### **JAMES MCDONALD**

James McDonald Associate Architects

The trend towards the kitchen being at the center of the home is one of the most significant. Clients are looking for bright spaces with lots of light and glass that open to the family room; the spaces are separate but interconnected. And, depending on the formality of the client, the living room is less important; we are even eliminating them entirely in some medium-sized homes.

The family entry/mudroom is critical. It's become an official entry to the house—we think of it as the family foyer—and clients want it to look good with nice built-ins, benches, closets and durable materials in upgraded finishes.

The other big trend is

loggias—covered indoor/out-door, three-season spaces with fireplace, grill and kitchenette. They are often made of stone and screened in. Clients are frequently requesting loggias instead of decks.

#### WILLIAM R. SUTTON

Sutton Yantis Associates Architects

There has been a fundamental change in what people want in their custom homes. Grand staircases and vaulted, multistory rooms were common, but designs today are more subdued and sophisticated, with greater attention to function. The challenge is to create something unique in a smaller space. For instance, in singlestory spaces we're designing more coffered and beamed ceilings to add interest.

People want formal foyers but don't want to see the stairwell as a centerpiece when they walk in. They want to pass to a stair hall with an elegantly constructed staircase.

This formality contrasts with the combined kitchen, family room and family eating areas. In the kitchen, the big, empty island surface now incorporates a sink and dishwasher so that the person at the sink faces out towards the family room area. Sociability is very important.

### **CHARLES STRUSE**

Miller/Custom Builders
We have seen a much higher
focus on energy efficiency,
both in systems and materials. For example, traditional
batt insulation packages have
largely been replaced by

spray-foam insulation. And we've gone from standard HVAC systems to high SEERrated and geothermal systems.

Another change we've seen is a trend towards en-suite baths for every bedroom. That's been the case with every house we've built over the last two years. We're also noticing that homeowners are investing in home-automation systems that include thermostats, alarm systems, door locks and lighting, all controlled by remote devices.

In a more general way, the level of information and overall education of homeowners is much different than it was. Through the Internet, on websites like Houzz, people find details and finishes they like and facilitate the design selection process on their own.







# **LOUNGE ACT**

Vicky Lal takes inspiration from a resort vacation in designing a chic lowerlevel entertainment center

A vacation in St. Tropez inspired Vicky Lal's fun and glitzy basement entertainment center. "We went to a lounge and I fell in love with the look," she recalls. So she came home and embarked on an elaborate project to renovate the lower level of her Potomac house.

With the help of architect Nate Penati, Lal conceived a series of spaces that would include a home theater, bar, dance floor, wine cellar and billiards area. "We wanted a place to hang out and entertain family and friends," Lal says. "I talked to my kids and husband about what they wanted and we started from there."

In the home theater, a 7.2 surround-sound system with a 120-inch projection screen is backlit by LED lights. Gaming systems are embedded under the screen, and club-grade, in-ceiling speakers are faux-painted to blend with the ceiling. The audio and lighting systems are controlled with a hand-held remote as well as an iPad mini that hangs on one wall.

The semi-circular bar is fully stocked; it pairs glass tile and quartz countertops for a sleek, contemporary look. A wine cellar includes a comfortable tasting area. Custom banquettes scattered about the basement provide extra seating and stools at the bar beckon. A plush carpet unifies the space. Illuminating the bar, home theater and dance floor are neon lights that can be changed out, with "a rainbow of colors to choose from," Lal says.



What are some guidelines to follow when installing a whole-house technology system, and how do you ensure its lighting plan will meet the clients' needs?







# **CUSTOM CREATION**

### Vincent Sagart blends style and convenience in a chic closet design

nterior architect Andreas Charalambous tapped Vincent Sagart of Poliform | Sagart Studio to create a practical yet luxurious dressing room with a clean-lined, modern look that would complement a client's new custom home in Arlington. Sagart put a premium on functionality in the nine-and-a-half-by-20-foot space in an effort "to simplify the clients' everyday life," he explains.

The area delineated for the closet was already configured when Sagart arrived on the scene. "We didn't change any of the architectural parameters," he comments. "We customized the space through the products we chose for it."

Sagart selected a closet system of textured walnut laminate with leather handles. Though the room is narrow, he was able to install 24-inch-deep cabinets—wider than those commonly found in closets—that fully protect hanging garments. He allotted two-thirds of the room to the wife, who wished to keep accessories, handbags and shoes in the same place.

"She had some very detailed ideas of what she wanted," he recalls. For example, a pull-out hamper accommodates two laundry bags, and dividers for scarves and jewelry make organizing easy. A full-height mirrored door conceals storage for formal gowns and tuxedos. Sagart incorporated two convenient Silestone surfaces with outlets for chargers and space for emptying pockets or folding clothes. Flat metal hooks above the shelves hang clothing ensembles and recessed LED lights illuminate each shelf.

Moooi pendants supply a definite "wow" factor to the space.

### TRADE SECRETS

- When embarking on a closet design, decide what is important to you. Build your closet around your habits and lifestyle, rather than adapting your habits to your closet design.
- Approach the design holistically, with a vision for the space as a whole and how its parts will fit together.
- If the space is narrow as this one was, sacrifice extra storage for maneuverability. If you can't move around, it will defeat the purpose.
- Lighting is very important. It has to be practical. But if possible, also include decorative lights like the Moooi chandeliers in this project that will make your heart jump when you walk in and will turn your dressing room into something special.
- Incorporate a flat surface into your design for personal items.





## SIMPLE + SERENE

Urban Country's design team combines neutral hues and comfortable, stylish furniture in a restful retreat

A fter downsizing to a 3,500-square-foot brownstone in the development of Symphony Park at Strathmore, a couple hired designer Linda Mann to decorate the interiors of their new four-bedroom, four-bath home. Mann—who frequently sources goods through Urban Country—worked with store owner Rachelle Roth and in-house designer Terri Johnson to select furnishings from the Bethesda showroom's collections and create a sophisticated refuge for their clients.


The couple, who had raised kids in a busy house for many years, wanted their new home to communicate a restful, calming vibe. "They're empty nesters," explains Roth. "They were ready for a change in lifestyle, with a soothing, more serene space to live in."

Against a backdrop of neutral colors and soft textures, the design team chose transitional pieces that are both comfortable and elegant. A Steinway baby grand piano anchors one end of the open-plan living/dining room, which also houses sofas and armchairs by Lee Industries and an over-sized custom Bolier dining table paired with chairs by Lillian August. A modern bronze-and-glass coffee table "introduces a little bit of glam to the room," says Roth.

The owners' contemporary artwork—including large paintings in the dining area and behind the piano—creates visual interest by adding splashes of color in the monochromatic space. A series of architectural prints complements an antique, custom-framed mirror above a sideboard by CR Currin in the dining area, while a custom sisal carpet unifies the room.

### **TRADE SECRETS**

- Hire a professional to help. You'll need a floor plan for furniture placement and a pro will know how to do it right.
- Consider whether each piece makes sense in your space. How will you use the room? Will people be watching TV or is easy conversation important? For example, if a lot of people will be using the room, you'll need a big sofa. Plan your space for optimal use.
- The scale of the furniture is important. Don't go with too many little pieces. But don't depend on one oversized piece either—less is sometimes better, but it has to have the proper scale. Again, consulting a professional will make all the difference.
- Make sure your designer understands your taste and that he or she is really listening to you.



### **MIX AND MATCH**

Today's trends reflect a transitional look that combines vintage or antique furnishings with more contemporary pieces. How do you help customers blend styles successfully?

### **JULIEN BIGAN**

Roche Bobois I don't necessarily recommend blending styles because it is not easy to do it well. At Roche Bobois, we have two distinct collections—Les Contemporains and Nouveaux Classiques—and customers sometimes wish to blend pieces from both collections. Remember that you can modernize an antique but you can't make contemporary pieces look old. In order to reinvent classical pieces, like our line of Louis XV tables and chairs, we add updated finishes, fabrics and colors. For example, we will put a Missoni Home fabric on a Louis XV chair or add silver trim to our Volutes dining table. You don't want the styles to be similar enough

to look as if combining them could be a mistake. The most successful combination is to match really old styles with contemporary pieces, as the contrast looks intentional and can be what makes it appealing.

### **ROBERT WILHITE**

Pompanoosuc Mills
As transitional furnishings become more popular, we are often asked to blend new pieces with more traditional designs that a client may already own. Ideally, we'll have an on-site consultation to see what the client already has, but we can also work with photos (this step helps our designers understand the client's budget and comfort level).

We have several methods of bridging styles and creating

harmony between old and new. For instance, we can make custom stains that coordinate with most traditional collections and edge/corner treatments and leg profiles that will contemporize an Early American or Shaker-inspired piece. We prefer not to incorporate inlays, carvings or finishes that may quickly seem outdated, opting instead for subtlety and understatement the enduring hallmarks of our designs. Above all, it's vital to understand the mood that the customer is trying to set.

### **FERNANDO RODRIGUES**

IMI Furniture

Combining different styles is challenging, so be sure to take the time to have a conversation with a professional about

how to do it right. It's very important to have the right resources—manufacturers who can customize a new piece to blend with an older piece or an antique. For example, you may find a piece you like but it's in the wrong finish for what you already have. Customizing the finish may give the piece a completely different look that will achieve the blend you're looking for. The current trend of painting furniture means you can pick out a paint color you like and take it to the manufacturer to duplicate.

Remember that if you are blending antique and modern styles, you don't need the pieces to match, you just need them to complement each other. Done correctly, blending styles can be beautiful.



This 4ft x 6ft painting was unveiled on Christmas, much to the surprise of the family. Gary described it as, "...the coolest present EVER!"



# **SOLAR GAIN**

### Architect Reena Racki lets in the light in a Woodley Park addition

The appeal of a gracious center-hall Colonial was diminished by a poorly constructed addition, so the owners called on Reena Racki to remedy the situation. She and her team remodeled the kitchen and replaced the existing addition with a new one that encompassed a family room and eating area, a mudroom leading to the garage and a powder room.

Since a front porch blocked sunlight from entering the interiors in the older part of the home, Racki wished to emphasize light and airiness in the south-facing addition. Nine-foot ceilings give way to an 11-and-a-half-foot ceiling in the addition, which is kept bright by white walls and floors in a pale, sand-hued porcelain tile, warmed in winter by radiant heat.

Seven-foot-tall casements open for cross ventilation, with transoms above and fixed window panels below. The windows are Jeld-Wen Custom Wood Clad low-E glass for low heat gain in summer and heat retention in winter. "We emphasize energy conservation in the context of climate control," Racki explains.

A partial wall separates the mudroom and powder room from the rest of the family room; Racki added transoms at ceiling height to bring in more light. A large Velux skylight, positioned in the angled family-room ceiling, directs light through French doors into the otherwise-dark living room.

Racki worked around a 60-foot oak tree in the backyard that created obstacles to the new construction, in part because the tree provided passive sun control. A separate screened porch echoes the style of the addition.

### **TRADE SECRETS**

- Windows are a very important component of any project. It is worth investing time and budget on them, as they affect the use and economy of a space so much.
- Never go with cheap windows. Economize on other things first; it's worth making trade-offs for quality windows, which influence heat gain and loss in the home.
- When deciding which windows to buy, take comfort level and use of space into account. How cozy do you want it? How open? Remember that heated floors can balance the climate in a space that has lots of windows.
- Window choices should not be made irrespective of other choices in the process. They should be synthesized with all aspects of the design. The process should be done holistically.



### **ECO-FRIENDLY EFFORT**

What are the latest trends in sustainable design? Describe the challenges of working with green versus conventional materials.

### **DAVID BALDWIN**

American Cedar and Millwork There is a strong push for green building and sustainable design. Architects are looking at cradle-to-grave sustainability—how much energy, time and money it takes to create, distribute and dispose of products. We make choices once or twice a day based on greenbuilding practices, looking at materials, performance and durability. Cost is not the main issue; it's longevity of products.

The latest trend is toward fiberglass surfaces, which meet a lot of energy codes, last a long time and are stable meaning they don't change with environmental conditions. Composite materials—like silica sand or fly ash combined with resins—make popular building materials. There's a trend away from vinyl products, which use

petroleum and are less durable.

The cost to stay green can be a challenge. Wood is still one of the best products but as old-growth timber disappears it's increasingly hard to find affordable, good-quality wood.

### TRICIA KESLING

Clark Hall Doors

For our clients, sustainability not only means a responsible attitude towards the environment, but—on a personal level—it means durability at home. Clients are choosing custom wrought-iron doors because they last forever and require almost no maintenance. Wrought iron looks like wood but offers the resilience of metal.

Wood is still a popular choice but today's wood isn't like the wood that was used on homes 200 years ago. It

comes from young forests and is not as hard or durable. It is subject to the elements, splitting and warping or becoming dried out and brittle. When we do make wood doors, we source sustainably forested areas that are carefully controlled and managed.

In terms of style, we are seeing simpler, less ornate designs both on interior and entry doors. Doors with clean, elegant lines speak to quality and the look people are trying to achieve.

### **GIGI PARR**

Bowers Design Build About 95 percent of our clients these days are thinking in terms of sustainability; people are looking at long-term returns and value.

In flooring, we are finding that in addition to

bamboo—which has long been popular—we're using reclaimed wood from old structures that are being torn down. We reuse wood that is 100 to 200 years old so it doesn't get wasted—clients love that it's aesthetically beautiful and has been salvaged.

Window technology has really advanced. The trend is towards open views in homes, so we're installing a lot of triple-pane glass, which maintains the home's envelope while emphasizing vistas and natural light.

We're seeing an increase in unusual materials in the entry doors we're installing, including salvaged wood and iron. Iron doors are very substantial and combining them with a double-paned glass window is more secure than a door made with wood and glass.

# RICH + REFINED

### Nestor Santa-Cruz imparts casual elegance to a hip DC condo

A two-bedroom condo in downtown DC's trendy 14th Street Corridor lured a bachelor just returning from a stint working in London. However, the space—encompassing a living/dining area, two bedrooms and a huge terrace—lacked personality and definition, so the owner tapped Nestor Santa-Cruz to create a look that would reflect his cosmopolitan lifestyle, incorporating artwork and mementos and instilling the space with a sense of casual elegance.

The first hurdle was the exposed ductwork that lined the ceiling, conveying an edgy, industrial sensibility that didn't necessarily jibe with the owner's refined furnishings and style. "The building was intended to have an industrial aspect," says Santa-Cruz. "We would have had to lower the ceiling to cover the ducts anyway. So we said, 'let the ceiling be its own plane.' It became a sort of sculpture woven throughout."

The owner was drawn to an Art Deco aesthetic, so in the main living space Santa-Cruz selected furniture and accessories from that era, including openbacked spoon chairs and console lamps made of ammonite and coral. An early 19th-century French typographer's table from Marston Luce doubles as both desk and dining table, while iron and leather chairs from Hickory Chair echo a design by Jean-Michel Frank. An existing plush sofa was reshaped, reupholstered and paired with a 1970s plated chrome-andglass coffee table from Jansen. A rug from Timothy Paul Home delineates the seating area. A Chinese cupboard from the owner's collection creates a focal point in the room.

### **TRADE SECRETS**

- First, create an optimal furniture layout with your interior designer; you can always use your existing pieces as a mock-up. The layout is what gives a room its structure. Take height into account and think in inches—they count!
- You don't need everyone's opinion. Work with your designer. If you hired a designer based on previous work, that should establish a sense of trust.
- When in doubt, over-scale a little.

  Too many little pieces don't give proper scale to a room. Less is more—what you take out is more important than what stays!
- Start with a realistic budget. High and low is okay; your designer should know where to splurge and where to save.
- Visual comfort is as important as physical comfort—but design for use, not for show.

### **COMMON LANGUAGE**

As an interior designer, how do you ensure from the outset that a project will reflect a client's taste, style and needs?

### **BARBARA HAWTHORN**

Barbara Hawthorn Interiors We start out with a programming meeting where we review photographs and discuss exactly what clients are attracted to. We can tell right away if they're traditional, transitional, eclectic or modern. Then we do what I call my "gestalt" test: We show them Ziploc bags full of fabrics in different color groupings and ask them what they like. We do the same thing with wood, tile and stone. This gives us a great sense of what they gravitate towards.

Based on that meeting, we put together a master list of what they need in each space. And if we can't find an item, we make it.

To ensure a project's success, you should feel that you can say anything to your designer and he or she won't be offended. And the designer should really want to hear what you have to say. It should be easy.

### **PAULA GRACE HALEWSKI**

Paula Grace Designs, Inc.
First, I share an article I've
written on the principles and
elements of quality design.
This gives clients a common language so we know
we're talking about the same
things in terms of symmetry,
scale and proportion. This is
paramount.

Sometimes people have an image in their minds; it's what they think they should have

versus what they really like. To define what their style really is, I ask clients to make idea books on Houzz and then we discuss the photos together. We talk a lot about the mood they're trying to create as well as about function.

I also ask if there are particular places we can go and see to identify the feel they are after. I have gone to restaurants, hotels and previous clients' houses. It's priceless to be in a space and get the vibe.

### **ANDREA HOUCK**

A. Houck Designs
First, I assess the core scope of
the work because every client
is different. Some are empty
nesters, some need a renovation, some just need help

with color. We go through a series of meetings and I give them a large stack of shelter magazines with Post-It notes. I ask them to flag images they like—both advertising and editorial—then I study the photos to see if I can distinguish their taste and style. This gives me a way to focus and get inside their heads.

Then I follow up with elaborate drawings. I do 2D flat plans and 3D elevation drawings showing furniture, changes to the walls and lighting. I create renderings because a lot of people are not able to visualize how everything will look. And I purposely don't color in the drawings so that color preferences don't skew the process.

### **ARTISTIC VISION**

Designer Paul Bentham infuses a modern kitchen with a playful, Pop-Art sensibility

The owners of a Bethesda home hadn't touched its outdated kitchen since the house was built in the 1980s. When they were ready for a change, they contacted Paul Bentham of Jennifer Gilmer Kitchen & Bath to create an updated, contemporary space. "They have Pop-Art taste," Bentham says. "They have a lot of that kind of art and wanted a kitchen that would complement it, with a sort of European feel."

Bentham designed a more convenient layout by replacing a space-squandering, L-shaped island with a functional, linear one that is longer and wider than the original. He also removed the bulky, freestanding range and hood, which took up too much space, and substituted a streamlined, 42-inch cooktop and 48-inch hood. All the appliances are Miele.

The original cabinetry was clad in a mundane laminate popular in the 1980s. "The owners wanted things bright, but they have a penchant for grays, so though I started out designing with only gray, I ended up introducing red for interest," Bentham says. The new cabinets are a lively mix of the two colors, made of a high-gloss, acrylic-based laminate that creates a strong sheen. They are paired with honed, Absolute Black granite countertops.

A bank of red pantry cupboards has been elevated and lit from above and below. The light over the island—a Philips Ledalite—is an industrial fixture that the clients chose; made of polished chrome, it adds the final touch to the sleek, modern kitchen.

### TRADE SECRETS


- In most cases, it's best to follow the general shape of the room when designing how the kitchen will flow. In a long room, a linear feel with horizontal cabinet lines and handles will work best.
- Keep in mind that you can achieve an interesting look through subtle variations in a kitchen. For example, materials in the same color can have different looks and depths if they come in variable sheens.
- Take a step out of the norm by using LED lighting that points in different directions, such as down-lighting that will bounce light from various cabinet depths and heights off of walls and ceilings.
- Consider your lifestyle and choose materials accordingly. For instance, high-gloss paint finishes will not wear well for a young family with pets.





### **A CAREFUL EVOLUTION**

How do you successfully launch a kitchen or bath makeover and what advice can you offer homeowners contemplating one of their own?

### **EMILY EADS**

Poggenpohl We begin the renovation process with a consultation in which we ascertain how the kitchen needs to function for a client's lifestyle. Do they have young children? Do they entertain a lot? Do they cook quite a bit? And how will the kitchen fit in with the rest of their interiors? Once we have determined what is important to them, we come up with a design concept that we feel will best fit their needs.

A common misconception is that one needs a built-in microwave. We feel that microwaves are on the way out and will soon be replaced by steam ovens, which offer a less drying approach to reheating

food. If the client feels they need a microwave, we often suggest putting it in a closed cabinet and not making it an investment piece of the appliance package.

When renovating a kitchen where people now spend more time than in their living rooms or family rooms—pre-planning is extremely important. One of the most common mistakes people make is they've seen a picture they like in a magazine but at the end of the day it is not going to create a kitchen that's right for them. It might look nice, but the clients have not taken the time to think

about the extra counter space or drawers they'll need.

Homeowners need to consider the existing deficiencies of their kitchen. Are you a big bulk shopper who needs a huge pantry? Are you a wine drinker who needs lots of storage? A professional kitchen designer will review the wish list and figure out how to create a plan that will address the deficiencies and how the clients want to use their kitchen.

### **JERRY WEED**

Kitchen and Bath Studios One mistake is rushing the project. A kitchen renovation puts you under a lot of stress and people don't make good decisions under stress. You're talking about a space that's

going to be an intimate part of your everyday life for a 10-year period. But it's less stressful if you have time to accumulate knowledge. Allow a month in the planning stage so you can do it comfortably.

If you start to think about everything at once, most people freeze up. Instead, think about the project by square footage. Cabinets and flooring make up the most square footage so start out focusing on them. Then go on to the countertop and appliances. I think about backsplash tile like a man in a suit picking out a necktie. That's where you can have a little fun and bring out a little color. It's a nice, safe place to show some personality.

# **GOING NATIVE**

A Chestertown garden is transformed with luxurious new amenities and indigenous plant life


andscape architect John Gutting had begun to revive the grounds of his daughter's home in historic Chestertown, Maryland, but, sadly, was unable to design the second, most ambitious phase of the project. After Gutting passed away in 2006, the family hired landscape architect Miles Barnard to tackle the job while respecting Gutting's design vision and dedication to indigenous plants.

The project scope was complex, especially given that the lot measured a mere half-acre. Designed to complement a renovation to the house, the new landscape plan would include a pool makeover, the design and construction of a pool house and the creation of a drainage system to capture rainwater. It also called for new garden gates, brick walls, cedar fencing and a lighting plan. "Our goal was to create a biologically diverse, indigenous landscape with quality materials consistent with the house, enhance privacy and create functional space," Barnard explains.

The homeowners now enjoy al fresco areas for dining and showering, space to sunbathe and a pool house with a kitchen and bath—amidst native plants including Sweetbay magnolia, dwarf fothergilla and Black-Eyed Susan.

"The lush landscape feels like an oasis in downtown Chestertown," says Barnard. "A space should look good, but it's most important for it to feel good and have a sense of spatial security."

### TRADE SECRETS

- Consider the whole property as a single composition. Don't get lost designing one space without thinking about how it relates to others in terms of materials, scale, function and circulation.
- Take soil samples at the beginning of the project and have them tested for pH, calcium, organic matter, nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium. Selecting plants without knowing this information is like selecting windows for a house without knowing which direction is north.
- Make a vision statement for the project with your landscape architect at the very beginning of the process. Follow that up with a list of things you want to see or experience in the final built product. I give my clients a questionnaire when we first meet so that I can better understand their expectations.

### **DESIGNING A ROAD MAP**

What are the most important components involved in planning a successful landscape project, and what are some pitfalls to avoid?

### **JOSH FRANKLIN**

Deckscapes of Virginia, LLC In the first meeting, I normally try to tackle two things: I am looking for a design program and beginning to evaluate the site, finding out what constraints and opportunities there are as well as getting the client's feedback. I take that information and begin to diagram how I can accomplish everything they want.

These diagrams generally transition into modeling. I use software called Google SketchUp, which adds to the dynamic of how someone can see a project take shape. The third step in the project is the actual conceptual design, where I map out where the planting beds will go, the size of the patio, etc.

Doing due diligence to get to the conceptual design phase through site analysis, a proper design and a well-though-out diagram or model can eliminate a lot of the headaches that designers sometimes deal with later on.

### **JOHN GAMBA, RLA, ASLA**

Through the Garden, Inc. A company might do a master plan and install it in phases. Being a landscape architect, I put a lot of value in the design process. I like to take my time and think about the future. Maybe in a later phase clients want to build a pool. We need to know that now so we can avoid redundant work.

The design plan becomes a road map and a great communication tool—even between

a husband and a wife. On a recent project, the wife thought she was getting a pool and the husband thought he was getting a basketball court! The plan keeps everyone on the same page.

Design fees usually are about one percent of total installation fees. Some people worry it's an added expense, but the amount of work it saves winds up being money in a client's pockets.

### **GREG SHANNON**

Wheat's Landscape A well-designed landscape starts with the end in mind. At our first meeting with a new client, we look to clearly identify the key objectives of the project and the key elements on the client's wish list. After

we have a project scope, the next item we need to address is the budget. Talking about budgets up-front is critical to delivering a great project in a timely fashion.

The purpose of this conversation is not to identify what the client has set aside for the project and then to spend every available dollar. Rather, the goal is to match the available budget to expectations.

One common pitfall is not ensuring everything is in writing; having documented correspondence and approvals eliminates confusion, especially with design details. Complex projects have hundreds of details and we strive to have them identified and approved long before we go into production.

A homeowner was drawn to a McLean, Virginia, rambler for its location and promise of easy, one-story living. However, the unappealing, dated exterior needed an overhaul. She hired architectural designer Christina Doyle of Gilday Renovations to transform the home, both inside and out.

# TREE HOUSE CHARM

Gardner Mohr Architects revives a dilapidated house in the woods with sustainability and style

t was a traue-on. A constructed house, circa 1969, was t was a trade-off: A run-down, poorly located on a spectacular site in Bethesda. The owners were forced to either raze or remodel their home when burst pipes rendered the place uninhabitable; zoning constraints and a goal of preserving existing trees made them opt to remodel. They called on Amy Gardner of Gardner Mohr Architects to create a space that would answer their wishes for a modern, energyefficient abode with a strong connection to the outdoors.


"The position and orientation of the house were ideal for views and passive solar and natural ventilation, as well as the creation of secluded outdoor spaces," Gardner says. Located on a sloping lot, the home had a tree house feel to it that the owners wanted to preserve. Gardner and her team designed a whole-house overhaul that would "improve the general building fabric and systems, extend the sense of living outdoors to all seasons and add strategically, staying within the original footprint."

Doors and windows were enlarged and, in most cases, relocated to capture views. New porches and decks forge a connection to the outdoors, while the new, modern kitchen and baths-including a master bath that cantilevers over the south deck like a tree house—add convenience.

In the interest of preserving the existing structure, Gardner and her team removed, refinished and reinstalled the cedar siding using a rainscreen assembly. Next on the list: a landscape plan that will preserve the wooded site while creating an oasis of native species and a bird garden.



#### **TRADE SECRETS**


- I often recommend an energy audit at the beginning of a renovation, in order to study performance and value. Starting with such information can guide aspects of the project, including significant budget decisions.
- Create a tiered list of goals: musthaves, desired options, wish list. Let it evolve during the first schematic design phase of the project, when options arise that can impact those original goals.
- Develop an understanding of the interconnectedness of elements within the house. We find this to be among our clients' biggest challenges when managing scope and budget.
- Summarize a project budget that includes construction, permit costs, contingency funds (often overlooked in the creation of a budget) and professional fees.




