









EDITOR'S MESSAGE

reader in Kentucky sent me a letter recently. "I bought your magazine to get some ideas for our home," she wrote. "We have the taste, but not the funds. Is there anything for us to do?"

Like most high-end shelter magazines, *Home & Design* features exceptional residences in which the price tag of a single rug may exceed another homeowner's entire budget. Of course, we don't mean to suggest that you need a six-figure sum to create the home of your dreams. Instead, it is our mission to spotlight our region's most remarkable abodes, where architects and designers have reached new, creative heights. We hope our pages will inspire you to create a home you love that reflects your own style and resources.

Designer Sophie Prévost of Washington-based ColePrévost accomplished this very feat in a New York bachelor's apartment (page 48). She adhered to her client's budget, carefully mingling a few splurges with practical finds. "It is important to have a good neutral core, but invest in a few special 'jewels," she says. "It's like wearing Gap with an Hèrmes scarf."

Most designers I know embrace this "high-low" strategy. While the Washington area has remained somewhat immune to the economic downturn faced by much of the country, homeowners at all income levels have become more cost-conscious as they embark on design projects. That said, an investment in your home—both financially and emotionally—will reap rewards for many years to come.

A couple turned to designer Frank Babb Randolph and architect Christian Zapatka to revive their 1930s Arlington home (see "Living Light" on page 122). Honoring its provenance, Zapatka gave the home architectural gravitas, while Randolph removed more than he added. And although he furnished the home with designer finds and antiques, Randolph advised

his clients to change out more affordable items, such as flowers and fruit, pillows and accessories, to suit the season or a whim.

Whether planning a major remodel or simply sprucing up a room for spring, we can all learn valuable lessons from this project and the others we cover. I hope this issue motivates you to make your home sing.







MODERN makeover

Interior designer Sophie Prévost creates a sophisticated New York City bachelor pad—on a budget


fter purchasing a condo in New York City's Flatiron District, telecommunications executive Brian Gelfand decided to create a "modern, relaxing and enjoyable" home where he could kick back with friends. "My first idea was to decorate it myself but I quickly came to the realization that I wasn't good at it," he admits.

Next, he contacted family friends, DC-based designers Robert Cole and Sophie Prévost, whose contemporary interiors he admired. "I had seen their work in magazines and liked their style," he says. "It's modern but warm at the same time."

Gelfand frequently travels for business to Bethesda, where he grew up, and was able to consult Cole and Prévost at their Dupont Circle offices. "He showed us pictures of what he liked—pieces with clean lines and neutral colors, but not ultra-modern," recalls Prévost, who led

the design effort. "He wanted a grown-up apartment, so we turned the condo into a sophisticated bachelor pad."

Drawn to the Fifth Avenue property for its high ceilings, open plan and contemporary kitchen, Gelfand says the 1,613-square-foot unit is "a big improvement from where I had been living." An office off the foyer allows him to work from home and the living/dining area provides enough room for entertaining. "My previous apartment was too small to allow for that," he notes.

Part of Prévost's charge was to find affordable furnishings within the 30-year-old homeowner's budget of about \$50,000, which is considered modest for most Washington designers. Prévost selected many pieces from Jesse Furniture, an Italian manufacturer that used to have a showroom at Tysons Corner Galleria. "They have a nice, clean look and aren't that expensive," says Gelfand of the company's designs.

In the living room, simple, boxy sofas from Jesse are arranged to face a flatscreen TV mounted on a walnut wall sys-

tem, also from the Italian manufacturer. The chevron-patterned rug was chosen for its graphic play on a men's suiting pattern.

"It is important to have a good neutral core," says Prévost of budget-conscious designs such as this one. "But make sure to invest in a few special 'jewels.' It is like wearing Gap with an Hèrmes scarf." In the living room, the jewels are reproductions of classic modern designs—Isamu Noguchi's Mid-Century coffee table, Hans Wegner's three-legged shell chair and an Ingo Maurer lamp, which all stand out as sculptures within the pared-down décor.

Over the sofa, a brightly striped print by Washington Color School artist Gene Davis reminds Gelfand of his DC-area






roots. "Artwork is available on all budgets, personalizes your space and gives it character," says Prévost. "It takes work to find the right pieces, but is well worth it."

To maintain the visual flow, the designer extended the living room's pale colors and wood finishes into the dining area next to the open kitchen. White-upholstered Jesse chairs are pulled up to a glass-topped table with a wooden base, and arranged under a spidery chandelier left by the condo's previous owner. A Peter Lik photograph of the Flatiron Building on one wall captures the namesake of the neighborhood where Gelfand now lives.

At the opposite end of the dining space, a large, round mirror and a Jesse console are mounted on a wall painted vibrant gold. "Paint is such a wonderful way to transform a space on a tight budget," says Prévost. "In this apartment, it adds depth, glow and an unexpected splash of color to an otherwise neutral scheme."

The designer emphasizes that an important part of this makeover was changing the lighting. A combination of recessed down-lights in the ceilings, table and floor lamps, and daylight from tall windows ensures the appropriate levels of brightness at all hours. "The fixtures do not have to be pricey—Home Depot has great





selections—but they do need to be appropriately selected and judiciously placed," advises Prévost.

In the master suite, two lamps and a rug from Room & Board accompany the Jesse bed. An Eames lounge chair and ottoman in the corner of the room offer a comfortable spot to relax. "Those were some of

the few pieces I kept from my last place," the owner says. "Otherwise, this apartment was a fresh start for me." *














s the agent for some of the world's most famous athletes, David Falk is on call virtually 24/7. Whether a client phones him for advice on a trade, a deal or a girlfriend, this trusted mentor picks up.

Since launching his career in 1974 at DC-based ProServ, Falk has broken new ground negotiating record-setting, multimillion-dollar contracts and endorsements for the likes of Michael Jordan, Alonzo Mourning, Patrick Ewing—and the list goes on. In 1992, Falk launched his own firm, Falk Associates Management Enterprises (FAME), later acquired by SFX. As chairman of SFX Sports Group, Falk grew its client base from 40 to 1,100. "David is as competitive in business as any athlete I've played against on the basket-



ball court," wrote Michael Jordan in the introduction of Falk's 2009 memoir, *The Bald Truth: Secrets of Success from the Locker Room to the Boardroom.*

In 2007, Falk left SFX to relaunch FAME as a boutique firm, where he now represents only a handful of athletes at a time. "I wanted a chance to smell the roses," says the self-described "Type A+" personality. He wanted more time to play golf, travel and enjoy the vacation home on Kiawah Island, South Carolina, that he shares with his wife, Rhonda.

The Rockville, Maryland-based couple decided to build the oceanfront residence when the eldest of their two daughters was about to leave for college. "We wanted a place for the girls to come home to," says Falk, who grew up near the beach on Long Island. "My parents had very limited funds," he recalls. "I only went on three vacations before high school. The beach had a psychically soothing significance to me. I always dreamed of having a beach home."

The Falks purchased two adjacent oceanfront lots on Kiawah and entrusted Washington, DC, architect Jerry Harpole to design their residence. Harpole, who had designed a home for Falk's former partner, Curtis Polk, developed a plan that would fit in with the neighboring homes, yet realize his clients' vision. A strict architectural review board scrutinized his every move.

"A lot of the houses in Kiawah are in the Northeast Coast Shingle style," Harpole says. "I'm from the South and that didn't make sense to me. I thought it should be much more Southern in character. I tried to achieve more of that Low

Country, almost Victorian, style with big wide overhangs and brackets."

While the Falks initially hoped for something more contemporary, they embraced Harpole's nod to the Charleston vernacular. A traditional double wedding staircase leads to the front entry tower. Three tower volumes on the back of the home are designed so that virtually every room enjoys breathtaking ocean views.

The transitional exterior gives way to open, modern interiors. The heart of the home is a double-story ellipse banded, like a luxury vessel, in stainless steel. The vaulted space houses a large common living area flanked on one side by the kitchen and dining room volume. A curved wall screens off the two-story master bedroom suite housed in the other tower. In the central octagonal tower, a cozy sitting area occupies the ground level while above it, David Falk's glass-enclosed office juts into the landscape with 180-degree views of the shore. "It's all about the view," says Harpole, who also helped his clients decorate the interiors.

From custom "wave" stair rails to aquamarine mosaics, bubble-glass tabletops, hand-cast shell accents and a green and



turquoise color scheme, sophisticated allusions to the sea abound. "Jerry did a great job interpreting something I could never have drawn," says Falk, "though I had a notion of what we wanted it to look like."

Rhonda Falk agrees, "Our builder said he'd never seen an architect who had such an eye for finishes and quality as Jerry."

The second story of the home contains three guest suites, while the top floor is devoted to apartments for the couple's grown daughters, Daina and Jocelyn. Below, a stunning lap pool spills into a sculptural waterfall clad in blue Waterworks tile. A spa and an outdoor fireplace occupy pavilions at either end of the pool.

Throughout the design phase, both Falks worked closely with Harpole. "We met many, many times," says the designer. "David is a very passionate person about



whatever he's involved in and looked at every fabric and material. He was like a kid with a new toy."

Now that—in theory—David Falk has more free time, he is "spreading his wings" and trying new pursuits—from opening restaurants to producing movies. He currently has a documentary in the works on his "hero" and one-time client John Thompson, the former Georgetown University basketball coach.

In the well-appointed master suite (above), Harpole grounded the bed against a wall of wood in a stain reminiscent of the inky night sea. A glass-tile fireplace, mosaic border on the floor and banded curtains in gradations of blue and white pay homage to surf and sky. Marble mosaics by Waterworks embellish the master bath (left), where an acrylic tub designed by Harpole takes in ocean views.

Kevazingo and mahogany millwork befitting a yacht and a porthole window embellish the small entry room (below) that leads into a relaxing guest room (right, bottom) housed in the home's octagonal front tower.



Falk credits his mother, Pearl Falk—a teacher and interpreter—with his perfectionism and passion for learning. He studied economics at Syracuse University, where he met Rhonda. Two years later, she followed him to DC, where he earned a law degree at George Washington University. They were married in 1974.

Rhonda recently threw David a 60th-birthday golf tournament and roast at Woodmont Country Club in Rockville, Maryland, and all of his former clients—from Dikembe Mutombo to Jeff Green—attended. "It was like a Hall of Fame," David Falk muses.

Last year, the Falks committed \$15 million to Syracuse, establishing the David B. Falk College of Sport and Human Dynamics. "It's a gift to be in a position to do this kind of thing," says David Falk, who hopes the program will bring about an intersection between academia and experiential learning. "If all you're going to do is the same thing that everyone else is doing, why will someone hire you?" he asks intensely. "Really successful people have an affinity for seeing the road ahead."



Eleven innovative projects combine style and function

arry Rosen of Jack Rosen Custom Kitchens was given several mandates by the homeowners when he was tapped to design their new kitchen: Replace the room's traditional appearance with a sleek, modern aesthetic; integrate a large island with an abundance of surface space; and clear the clutter, removing small appliances from sight.

Rosen substituted a drywall soffit and heavy crown moldings with full-height cabinetry to the ceiling, then selected a flat-panel cabinet style for a contemporary look. He installed a large island with a capacious countertop and comfortable seating. To contain the clutter, he ingeniously designed a workspace that houses a countertop, coffee





A Perfect Transition

hen it was time to overhaul their large but dysfunctional kitchen, homeowners turned to Jennifer Gilmer to make sense of the space, which was poorly laid out and felt disconnected from the rest of the house. Gilmer opened the kitchen up to the family room, creating a peninsula that serves as a bar area with a Sub-Zero wine cooler and beverage center. It's flanked on the family room side by tall cabinets for storing glassware, and by decorative open shelving and storage on the kitchen side.

Previously, the refrigerator had occupied a focal point in the kitchen. Gilmer moved it to the other side of the room, replacing it with a Wolf range topped with a stainless-steel hood. The refrigerator is now

Gilmer chose walnut cabinetry that complements the home's interiors. A light blue/ gray island keeps the room open and airy. The glass-tile backsplash provides the final touch.

wo amateur chefs wished to overhaul their poorly laid-out kitchen, which could only be accessed through the dining room of their home. An uneven floor made navigating the inconvenient space difficult, while a rotting window wall squandered energy efficiency.

The couple turned to KONST: Kitchen Interior Design to create a space that would address these issues while also adding professional-grade cooking equipment, better storage and a clean, modern aesthetic. Principal Jonas Carnemark added a hallway addition to provide access to the kitchen, leveled the floors and replaced the window walls. He configured the countertops to accommodate two cooks working simultaneously. Separate full-height fridge and freezer columns,



A New Direction

omeowners with a disjointed kitchen suffered from limited counter space and inferior storage. Tapped to solve their design issues, Jennifer Gilmer first redid the layout. She moved the door to the butler's pantry for better flow, replaced the sliding doors to the backyard with a single door to conserve wall space and centered the door to the dining room. Borrowing space from the adjacent dining room permitted her to reorient the banquette in the breakfast area, which in turn allowed the center island to be repositioned and enlarged.

Gilmer placed a breakfast bar at one end of the island and installed shelves above the oven cabinets to convey a sense of openness. She

Gray cabinets in a milk-paint finish and soapstone countertops finish the look.

rustrated by her narrow kitchen, the owner of a historic DC row house decided to open it up to the rest of the home with a complete redesign. She tapped architect Carmel Greer of District Design and Davida Rodriguez of Davida's Kitchen & Tiles for the job, which involved a couple of main goals: to reflect the client's Scandinavian heritage with a functional, minimalist design; and to showcase a collection of bowls and utensils that the client collected on frequent trips to Africa.

The new floor plan called for the wall separating the kitchen from the rest of the main floor to be removed and a pantry to be replaced by a mudroom addition. Based on these plans,

young couple wished to update the kitchen of their Capitol Hill row house. However, their vision was challenged by a tight budget and the space limitations of their property. They tapped Kelly Davies of p + p construction to transform their cramped old kitchen into a modern, functional space.

The first goal of Davies's design was to bring light into the galley-style kitchen. French doors now occupy one end of the room, and a window back-splash has been installed above the sink. Soapstone countertops extend through the window to create an exterior ledge that brings the outside in. Oak floors match the existing floors throughout the house, connecting the new kitchen with



n a spare, contemporary master bath, a sculptural soaking tub creates a focal point, poised beneath a picture window so as to take full advantage of the view while to one side a niche displaying artwork gives bathers another viewing option.

LIVING LIGHT

Frank Babb Randolph and Christian Zapatka infuse a 1930s Arlington home with a 21st-century vibe

he big fieldstone house occupied a quiet Arlington side street, a stalwart reminder of a time when men went to work in suits and wives awaited their return holding cocktails. Designer Frank Babb Randolph met the current homeowners at a party and came over to survey their house after they suggested it might be a true test of his talent. The house needed Randolph's reductive touch—a penchant for simplifying spaces that he honed years ago under his mentor, the great New York designer Billy Baldwin.


He started in the living room. "I substituted some of their heavy mahogany furniture for pale Swedish pieces, reupholstered others in lighter fabrics and replaced the carpet with a sisal rug," he says. "That's when [the owner] realized how much lighter everything looked and decided she wanted the same minimizing approach for the second floor." In short order, Randolph had opened the rooms to light the couple never knew they had and adorned them with his signature pale, neutral palette. It was a cosmetic fix, though, and the designer knew in-depth work would be necessary to really transform the house.

The homeowners were empty nesters, long transplanted from their hometown of Richmond to the DC area where the husband works as a trial attorney. However, with three adult children descending frequently with their growing broods, he and his wife were looking to do more than refresh a home of 20 years. They didn't shy away from the magnitude of work Randolph proposed, which included completely revising the bedrooms and baths upstairs. "You need an architect," he told them. "We can open up the house, but let's do it right by moving walls and stairs and whatever else we need for a better flow."

The designer introduced the couple to Christian Zapatka, a Georgetown-based architect trained in the classical elements and proportions Randolph likes as a backdrop for his work. "Christian has an eye for the good bones often hidden in older houses and knows how to bring them out," explains Randolph.

Touring the house from top to bottom, Zapatka reimagined an exterior architecture shed of its country-mouse demeanor. "I saw a smart center hall Colonial inside this Pennsylvania-style

stone farmhouse," he recalls. Some of his exterior changes, such as adding dormer windows and remodeling the front entry and side porch, use classically ennobling details and deliver more sunlight to formerly dark interiors. They achieve an update more appropriate to the home's proximity to DC. "Basically," says Zapatka, "we teamed up to distinguish the house."

Inside, the architect reconfigured the second floor to create a spacious master suite, replacing a bath and a closet at either end of the hallway with windows that admit light to the whole upstairs. He also expanded the home's usable space to the attic and basement, which were wasted on storage. Now, the attic houses an exercise room and the wife's office—both well lit by two new dormers. Remodeling the basement revealed that the foundation had settled and its concrete-slab floor had become unstable. They lowered the floor 18 inches, exposing one long fieldstone foundation wall as a focal point to an informal family room.

Randolph and Zapatka brainstormed ways to ensure that the newly finished levels would feel accessible to the rest of the house. "We opened up three staircases that were enclosed or blocked by old, outmoded rooms," says Zapatka. "This simplified the circulation and afforded views down halls and to windows throughout the house. We also lifted the height of the doorways and windows and added new, classically inspired millwork."

The old screened porch off the living room got a new foundation and was transformed into a glass-enclosed space with a classical triglyph frieze along its cornice. Sunlight and a feeling of airiness broke through. And Randolph now had the broad canvas he needed for his pared-down, whitewashed style.

"I brought in a scrubbed look for the whole house," he says. He applied a matte, off-white hue from Farrow & Ball to the walls and

pickled the floors to create a bleached effect. The upholstery, in combinations of all-white tweeds, textures and subtle patterns, is easy on the eye and reflects light. "A pale room feels like it has more space and lets in more seating," Randolph explains.

In the sunroom, the mix includes a shimmery silk-and-wool area rug. Randolph selected Swedish antiques from favorite sources Tone on Tone in Bethesda and David Bell in Georgetown; their distressed, whitewashed finishes add to the lustrous lightness that permeates the house. Floors in the breakfast area and dining room are bare. "A puzzle pattern of rugs would break up the flow from room to room," Randolph observes. "I like the cleanness of furniture legs dancing on the pale wood."

Randolph treated color as a captivating top note. "Colors pop on a neutral canvas," he says. "I like bringing in select colors as accessories and then changing them out again as the mood suits." Trays, bowls, and baskets hold decorative and useful objects, and pillows, artwork, flowers and fruit provide other pops of color. These elements add personality, moving in and out with a season, a party or a whim.

With those finishing touches, the house finally entered the 21st century. Zapatka's bold presentation of classical architectural elements feels modern. Randolph's sunlit interiors convinced the wife that she never wants curtains. "She likes seeing cleanly through the house," says Randolph. "I call it living lighter."

A couple revives a centuries-old home with help from DC architect Ernesto Santalla



ife in the picturesque village of Rasteau, located in the foothills of the French Alps, revolves around winemaking. Most of the town's 700 residents tend the vineyards that produce the region's famous Côtes du Rhône wines.

The search for a vacation home in Provence led American Holly Glass and her Dutch husband, Jan Grent, to this sleepy outpost. Grent, who had recently retired, and Glass, a public relations consultant who works from home, were hoping to split their time between their Virginia residence and a home in France. Grent recalls the day a real estate agent invited them to tour a centuries-old house that had been built into Rasteau's original fortification walls. "We went to the top floor and out on the terrace and saw the views. I pinched Holly and she pinched me. We said, 'This is it,' and bought it."

With the patchwork of terracotta rooftops and vineyards unfolding below, it was easy to overlook the minor fact that the house was more or less unlivable. The previous owner, a 92-year-old wom-

an, utilized only one of the home's five levels, where a bathroom doubled as a kitchenette. Not only was the layout convoluted, but the roof leaked and the infrastructure was a shambles.

Immediately, the couple flew in Washington-based architect Ernesto Santalla to give the home a once-over. "Initially, they asked me to spend a couple of days with them and design a 'quickie renovation," recalls Santalla, who had completed two DC-area projects for the couple. "Famous last words."

After touring the home with Santalla and local contractor Patrice Blanc, the couple came to realize that the house—parts of which date back to the 12th century—needed a full restoration. "Everything had to be redone," says Glass, "from the plumbing and electricity to the heating, the walls, the fireplace and the floors."

Luckily, Blanc was well-versed in the region's building methods. "Patrice could immediately identify what was original and what was not Provençal detailing," says Santalla. "He could see through all the layers and point out what was not authentic."

Once the property was measured and blueprints drawn, Santalla returned to the States and formulated a plan that would upgrade the home and rework its layout while carefully preserving its historic legacy. He devised a logical floor plan that would give purpose to every level of the home. "The plan was recreated in a way that



made it much more feasible to live in the house the way we live now," Santalla explains.

The main level is accessible from the front door and now houses the master suite, a library and a cozy living room. The relocated kitchen and dining room on the top floor spill out onto the rebuilt terrace, where the couple enjoys meals during the warmer months. Descending from the main level, visitors reach a floor housing three guest rooms and a central kitchenette, which leads out to the new pool behind the house. Below the guest level is a media room and wine cellar and below that a party room where Grent, a musician, often plays the piano.

Since he would be orchestrating the project remotely, Santalla kept the design simple. "In a way, it was about stripping back many layers to get to a point where there was this common denominator that we could build from," the architect explains. "I had to minimize the amount of details the contractor needed to produce because I wasn't there. I had to have an approach that would work everywhere."

Keeping the material palette as minimalistic as possible plays up the home's architectural treasures—including centuries-old wooden beams, terracotta roof tiles and a weathered stone exterior. "We really worked hard to preserve what was considered original and took away everything that we knew was additive," Santalla says. "I wanted to emphasize all the really magnificent timbers that are almost magically holding up the structure."

Santalla selected large-format terracotta floor tiles, cable lighting and dark-stained steel railings to create the clean, modern look his clients favored. They also decided to order furniture exclusively from BoConcept since products they could test in the store's DC showroom are also available in France.

Construction began in September 2007. What Glass and Grent expected would be a seven-month process ultimately took twice as long. "Things move slowly in France," Grent admits.



During the restoration, the owners left the home's weathered stone exterior intact. Glass did not share her husband's relaxed view when she visited in January 2008 and found the house still open to the elements, without floors or walls in place. "I stood on the terrace and cried," she recalls. "I was overwhelmed and was having difficulty seeing the light at the end of the tunnel."

The couple also had to contend with the village mayor, who oversees architectural changes. He eventually granted permission for the pool—but not without protest from residents whose families have lived in Rasteau for generations. "It was a very unusual concept to build a pool in the middle of a medieval village," says Glass. "It had to be exactly in spec because we didn't want to infringe on our neighbors."

Though Grent and Glass were able to live in the home by the summer of 2008, it wasn't officially completed until 2010. Now settled into the rhythm of Rasteau, they couldn't be happier. "Ernesto kept it simple—but still the old spirit is there," Grent says. "He is extremely talented in that regard, mixing the ancient with the modern. He created a very thorough and thoughtful design."

The couple enjoys daily bike rides through Provence and visits to wineries with their frequent houseguests. A self-taught artist, Grent has taken up watercolor painting and drawing with India ink.

"When I'm here," says Glass, "I can't wait to get out of bed in the morning and look out the window. It's that kind of magic that Ernesto and Jan and I tried to envision in the very beginning. We finally have it." •

estled in Northern Virginia's Falls Church area, Lake Barcroft holds the enviable position of being the only lake inside DC's Capital Beltway. Its picturesque environs and proximity to the city have made this waterside community a big draw—and it's definitely what attracted a pair of homeowners to the non-descript split level they purchased there.

The couple—both litigation consultants—couldn't resist the property, with its direct, bird's eye view of the lake. They were less enthusiastic about the residence, which had remained pretty much untouched since its only previous owner, now 92, commissioned its construction in 1960. "The house was a time capsule," recalls one of the owners. "Everything was original!"

The couple was ready for some drastic changes, envisioning a very modern, light-filled structure that would take thorough advantage of the views. However, the house had been lovingly tended over the years and they were loath to tear it down. In fact, they rejected several architects who made this suggestion, eventually choosing Charles Moore and Jill Gilliand of Moore Architects, PC, who walked in and told them how to save the house instead. "They quickly saw a smart way to adapt it," says the homeowner, "to create an integrated, consistent and coherent home. We wanted to

respect the original structure, but turn it into something both aesthetic and functional."

As Moore sees it, "it would have been a cop-out to tear the house down." Instead, its original split-level structure provided inspiration and a sort of road map for the architects' renovation. Moore and Gilliand retained the split-level design from the first layout, dividing the new structure into specific, functional areas, each with its own level. The entry hall opens to the level above, which encompasses an open-plan living room, dining room, kitchen and butler's pantry with access to the garage. The next level up houses a floor of guest suites; above that the master suite perches like a tree house, complete with common area, bedroom and adjoining closet, and luxurious master bath. Back at entry level, a wide staircase leads down to a rec room and spacious home office.

Though distinctly contemporary in style, the front façade of the home remains in scale with the neighborhood of split-level houses around it. Retaining the inherent structure "allowed us to play with form," Moore says. For example, the design team erected a masonry wall that bisects the front façade and continues straight back to the rear of the house; to its right, a tall window sets up a visual axis all the way through, unifying front and back and revealing the views beyond.

The original house was clad in reclaimed Baltimore brick, but both homeowners and architects preferred a mix of stucco and cedar siding on the renovated exterior. "I like the cedar siding," Gilliand says. "It recalls the siding on the surrounding houses but with a modern attitude."

While the front of the house has been transformed, it's the back that packs the real dramatic effect. The homeowners were deter-





mined that the views down the 40-foot slope to the lake should be the focus of the interiors throughout, and Moore and Gilliand obliged with floor-to-ceiling windows flanking the entire back of the house. Three of the home's four levels offer access to the outdoors and its views via decks; the lower level opens to a slate patio with a plunge pool, water feature and plenty of space for entertaining, as well as a path leading down to the lake.

"What's really cool is how each level and space sort of clicks together," says the homeowner. "It's all open, yet separated. There are controlled views from space to space—there's really no place in the house where you don't have an amazing view."

Both homeowners were enthusiastic participants in the design process—and with their strong aesthetic vision, did the interior decorating themselves in consultation with Moore Architects. They opted for a sleek material palette of Caesarstone, limestone and granite for such surfaces as countertops, fireplace surrounds and baths. Built-ins in the master bedroom are made of tiger wood and the kitchen boasts custom wenge cabinetry. The entry hall floors are terrazzo tile and on the main floor, a combination of porcelain tile and maple flooring delineates the spaces. Simple, open metal staircases and railings add to the sense of airiness on each floor. Furnishings from Vastu provide the clean-lined sensibility





ith three teenage daughters, a Reston, Virginia, homeowner had her hands full. When she decided to renovate her 1980s-era house, her goal was to accommodate the family's busy yet casual lifestyle; along the way, she also hoped to modernize the design. She contacted designer Elizabeth Krial, who had previously worked with the family on an oceanfront property renovation, to realize her vision.

"They wanted a home that would be refined but relaxed enough for everyday life," recalls Krial. "This family is very active, but has a laid-back, easy-going attitude. So having comfortable spaces that are practical was key."

The result was a dramatic transformation—and nowhere is the change more evident than in the dining room. Prior to the remodel, the space was "heavy"—filled with traditional Queen Anne furniture and painted crimson with shiny moldings and lots of shadow boxes. Krial softened the room's design, adding a round table that makes it a more comfortable space to congregate for meals. "The round table is modern and more suitable for relaxed gatherings," she explains.

Light fixtures were chosen to make the room sparkle, and a handmade jardinière from France with layers of rich hand glazing offers a reflective focal point. "It's really important to have light that casts shadows and reflections to pick up on the details of the ceiling," Krial says. "I placed the jardinière on a pedestal so that it can be used as a luminaire during dinner parties; the candle flame dances and throws out intriguing patterns on the walls."

To give the illusion of more depth in the room, the designer commissioned a stunning triptych panel of flowering dogwood branches. Throughout the home, organic forms and hues are present—from the in-

tricate design of placemats that mimic a butterfly's wings to the serene, milky quality of the sage palette. Inspired by nature for its soothing, familiar qualities, Krial considers these signature elements of her work.

Even the draperies on the main level evoke the outdoors with their pebbly texture. Krial worked closely with the team at Tassels Window Couture to ensure that all the draperies would create a billowy effect. She chose a modern silk fabric, but made it more transitional by lining it with a flannel-like English bump cloth and hand-sewn trim.

According to Krial, each room in a house should serve a purpose. This was especially true for the study, a long narrow room with a large stone fireplace. "It was a very masculine poker room with sports memorabilia," explains Krial. "As the function of the room changed, its identity needed to be rediscovered." She revamped it into a multifunctional space that includes an organized home office area where the homeowner can pay bills, a computer station for the kids to do homework and a sitting area for board games and relaxing.

Krial also gave purpose to the rarely visited living room, turning it into a glamorous music room where one of the homeowner's daughters plays the piano. "When I thought of the room, I envisioned jazz music playing with people hanging out and having a great time," she says. "Now it's a room in which to sip a cocktail and listen to music."

In fact, this is the homeowner's favorite room in the house. "I love the vintage trumpets on the walls, the sound of my daughter playing piano and how my friends enjoy being in there," she says. "We jokingly call it 'The Lounge.' The room just has a great vibe and people always gravitate to it at parties."

The piano room may be the homeowner's most beloved spot, but it's the master suite that holds a special place in the designer's heart. "This space is dedicated to luxury and relaxation," she says. "I was thrilled that the client agreed to the palette for the master bedroom, as it is decidedly feminine!"

Inspiration for the suite came from an Atlanta-based artist's work called "Golden

Goose," an eglisome done on a black mirror with a cut-out in the shape of a large goose filled with golden straw. "I kept all the colors very classic so that the lavender walls would have more longevity," explains Krial.

Described by the designer as "the piéce de resistance" of the project, the adjoining dressing room area was originally a sitting room with very dark, oversized leather furniture. "When I saw the shape of the space, all I envisioned were fabulous rows of mirrored closets," Krial says. "This is every girl's dream!" To frame the space, the de-

signer chose curvy, laser-cut taffeta drapes that mimic the pattern in the carpet, which serves as the room's focal point.

With the addition of the new dressing room, Krial could eliminate the existing smaller closet and open up the floor plan for the master bathroom. She made room for a grand double-door entry and designed an II-foot custom vanity stained a chocolate shade to anchor the predominantly light-hued space.

"When we started this renovation project," recalls the homeowner, "my main objective was to create a relaxed, calm environment that was more transitional and updated. We achieved this—and more—by selecting subdued and subtle colors, bringing more natural light into the house and keeping a reference to nature." •



Lush landscapes capture the beauty of nature through innovative designs, inspired plantings and breathtaking views

An Unexpected Pleasure

A landscape by Guy Williams creates soothing vistas, secluded gathering spots—and moments of surprise

he owners of a 19thcentury farmhouse and adjacent 1920s main house wanted to unify the two disparate structures. They turned to the surrounding landscape to create the bond they wanted, hiring Guy Williams of DCA Landscape Architects to bring it all together.

"They requested an Old World European feeling throughout," Williams says. He seamlessly united the properties that span eight acres, lending texture and depth to the landscape by reorganizing existing trees and shrubs and controlling the views. Park-like lawns meld together with croquet and soccer fields, all connected by rustic stone paths and cobblestone-edged drives.

An uneven path (opposite) leads to an open, grassy area; layers of trees and plantings provide depth and texture. Hydrangeas adorn the path to the vegetable garden (above, left) while fieldstone risers (above, right) lead down to a soccer field. Established trees and perennials and a cobblestone-lined drive (left) enhance the 1920s home.






Williams ornamented his landscape plan with blooms (clockwise from above):
A decorative pot of flowers and ivy adorns a stone wall; clematis drapes the pergola near the tennis court; banks of azaleas and hydrangeas envelop the koi pond; and a stone path opens to mature trees and blossoming shrubs.

A new clay tennis court looks decades old in its lush green setting. Spectators can watch a game from under a unique handmade pergola, smothered with clematis and climbing roses, that was crafted using pegs instead of nails. There is also a break in the wall where a decorative wroughtiron gate allows a secluded view of the game from a bench set under the trees. Ivy planted in arches cut into a high stone wall softens the lines of the court, while a row of bleached hornbeams keeps it hidden from other parts of the garden.

Large trees surround the pool with a tapestry of leafy texture. Details such as an uneven flagstone deck, overflowing planters and wrought-iron gates in the stone wall make it feel part of a larger, established garden.

Surprising, secluded spots await discovery. A teak bench set amid coneflowers becomes a private place for morning coffee. Surrounded by a bank of transplanted azaleas, a hammock slung between two trees offers a shady respite. "There's a sense of magic in coming upon these little discoveries," Williams says.

French Flair


A château-style home in the Shenandoah Mountains gets a formal landscape to match

he panoramic views of the Shenandoah Mountains are the only giveaway that this expansive, 44-acre property is actually in Hume, Virginia, and not Europe. The stately stucco house, with its stone accents, cupola-topped garage and lush gardens, says "French château," inside and out.

It didn't start out that way. When landscape designer Mark Finlayson of Wheat's Landscape first saw it, the garden was "a shambles," with mundane garden-center plantings and a bland stretch of lawn. "The plants didn't go with the architecture of the home," he recalls.


Finlayson's vision was to create flowing garden "rooms" linked by natural stone paths that would satisfy the owners' request for a European-style landscape and














suit the home's architecture and interiors, which are filled with French antiques.

A striking, formal garden in front of the house centers around an antique French fountain from Provence. The garden is divided into quadrants bordered with dwarf Korean boxwood and filled with drifts of lavender. Muskogee crape myrtles add another layer of purple.

The rest of the gardens are more casual. Clumps of perennials—more than 60 varieties—are allowed to grow together for a disheveled cottage look.

An antique bistro set provides a cozy spot for coffee on a terrace garden near the front of the house. Climbing roses mingle in



beds with sweet woodruff and geraniums, while containers hold boxwoods and trailing petunias.

Another terrace garden outside the bedroom window allows the owners to enjoy the scenery from inside and out. A pink climbing rose arches over a window, while an ever-changing show of perennials offers fourseason interest. "There is always something blooming there," Finlayson says. �

A Formal Vision

Elaborate balustrades, columns and ornate statuary inspired Potomac homeowners, who tapped John Shorb of John Shorb Landscaping in Kensington, Maryland, to help them design and build their sprawling backyard. Shorb's challenge was to complement the formal, Grecian-style exedras and surrounding sculptures with plantings chosen to enhance the distinctive, formalized look the owners wanted. He and his team planted carefully clipped boxwoods, spiral-shaped evergreen shrubs and a formal rose garden, interspersed with neat beds of hydrangea and impatiens.

An Intimate Expanse

Critical Area Law presented a challenge in a waterfront project in Annapolis. Setback laws made construction problematic on the property, which was designed by DC-based Oehm Van Sweden and built by McHale Landscape Design, Inc., of Upper Marlboro, Maryland. Because impervious coverage such as hardscape was limited, Steve McHale and his team combined stone and turf around the pool area and patio. The 55-foot lap pool is nestled into a retaining wall, creating an intimate yet expansive landscape in a difficult location.



A Two-Tiered Solution

Michael Yeomans of Through the Garden in Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, was tasked with designing a multipurpose outdoor living area. The elaborate space would incorporate a kitchen/ barbeque, bar, patio area and two-tiered pool with a floating pathway around the barbeque island. Clients requested that he conceal the pool equipment, so Yeomans designed a "ruin" wall feature. The wall screens the equipment while creating an intimate, partially enclosed area that also includes a luxurious outdoor shower.



Decorative Elements

For Howard Cohen of Sterling, Virginia-based Surrounds, Inc., the task of enlivening a large, bland patio provided a challenge. He and his team bordered the space with a series of retaining walls that would house garden beds, and erected an arbor overhead to inject a sense of scale into the expanse. They finished by installing a simple decorative water feature for visual interest and soothing sound: three large vases that recycle water from an underground reservoir and are illuminated at night.





Evening Ambience

The owners of a home on Fishing Creek decided to situate their pool and patio waterside. They tapped Annapolisbased Walnut Hill Landscaping for the job, and they in turn enlisted Bill Strickland of Terra Nova Design in Crofton, Maryland, to create the lighting plan. Strickland emphasized both safety and aesthetics, conveying low-level ambience with soft, indirect lighting of cast aluminum. Uplighting highlights the treetops, outdoor fireplace and retaining wall. Downlights, intentionally directed below eye-level, illuminate walkways in the dark.






Perfect Symmetry

On a steeply sloped property, Jeff Gunther of Great Falls Landscapes in Sterling, Virginia, contended with a hodgepodge of elements from previous landscaping efforts to create a hospitable backyard for his clients. He constructed a 70-foot long retaining wall about four feet high to contain a harmoniously symmetrical patio with a water feature as its focal point and panoramic views of the streambed below. The fire pit, a perfect spot for gathering, doubles as a table when not in use. ❖

culptor Michael Enn Sirvet sits back in his studio office in industrial Beltsville, Maryland, taking a rare break. Within view of his metal-cutting and sanding equipment, draped for protection against flying dust, Sirvet lets fly a wistful thought: He would have liked a little more time with the dining table he created for the apartment of a sports legend.

Sirvet reminisces about this first major commission. The polished aluminum table featured a lacy pattern of holes—one for each point scored during the player's legendary career. That involved placing 32,292 holes, captured like balls in a nine-by-four-foot rectangular surface. Adding to the complexity, the scattered holes only overlap at the table's corners, where its top folds down over perfectly aligned, pierced legs.

Though the design appears effortless, Sirvet actually spent several months working out its intricate pattern. It took three weeks for a skilled machine shop in nearby Jessup, Maryland, to drill the thousands of precisely placed openings on a state-of-the-art, computer-controlled milling machine. When parts were bent and



assembled into final form, "The shippers were waiting," Sirvet recalls nostalgically.

The reflective moment passes as Sirvet enthusiastically expresses thanks for the opportunity this important commission gave him. "It pushed the limits of what you could do technologically with one piece of aluminum that size," he says. "How many people get to create that?"


Over the dozen years that Sirvet has been sculpting, he has crafted metal, wood and plastics; worked with manual and industrial processes; and designed for private, public and commercial settings.

A retrospective of his work is now on view among the contemporary European furnishings displayed in the ADLON showroom in Georgetown. His smalland large-scale sculptures are displayed on tables, mounted on walls and suspended from the ceiling. Fans can also view Sirvet's work at the Farragut West Metro, where his new public sculpture wraps two exterior walls with a series of openwork metal discs that glow with amber light like galaxies of stars.

Throughout his evolving career, one characteristic has distinguished Sirvet from many other artists. "I am a science geek," he readily acknowledges, crediting his father, "a brilliant mechanical engineer," for this interest. He points to a lifelong love of nature—growing up among the forests and wetlands of northern New Jersey, later camping at some 45 national parks—as his inspiration.



Sirvet received a degree in finance and art history from Fordham University before deciding to study engineering at the University of Maryland. He took sculpture classes too, and stresses the links between science and art. "Structural engineering is more creative than people think," he says. "You're designing skeletons of buildings. You're working closely with architects, suggesting alternatives such as 'If you want this, it will cost \$80,000. If you do it this way, it's \$8,000.' You are in a creative process at the same time as the technical part."





Sirvet worked as a professional engineer for 10 years, but soon felt sculpture's pull. The magnet became stronger in 2000, when his friend, sculptor Sam Noto, suggested that Sirvet create a piece to exhibit at DC's Artomatic that year. Noto also offered studio space in his workshop—which the two friends still share with four other sculptors today.

"Thrust" was completed in time for the show—after the budding sculptor worked on it almost nonstop for more than 200 hours. His first serious sculpture, it took the form of a projecting wave constructed of small steel plates hinged together with bolts. He knew the technique well, since as an engineer he often visited building sites and took photos of beautiful structural connections. In this application, the sculpture's sweeping curve could be easily adjusted by tightening or loosening the bolts; these connections are part of the design's beauty.

Sirvet continued to adapt the technique in varied forms and materials. "Weeping Phoenix of 2004," now hanging at AD-LON, is a graceful, symmetrical canopy rising eight feet. Its 262 polished-aluminum plates are assembled in rows. When the piece was displayed in a gallery in New York, it served an unexpected purpose—a couple was married beneath it.

The sculptor soon moved on to organic forms, still precisely engineered. To shape these jigsaw pieces he used a plasma cutter—an electric torch that slices through

metal as sparks fly. The brass, copper or aluminum shapes were then connected with bolts to hardwood or Plexiglas.

In 2008, after working almost full-time as both engineer and sculptor, Sirvet decided to leave engineering. At that time in his art, he recalls, "I started to embrace 'engineered' decay." His pieces became twisted and often riddled with holes, an approach that, he confesses, was obsessive.

It was also successful: Sirvet won the 2009 Award for Excellence in Metal Craft, presented by the James Renwick Alliance at Artomatic, for "Millennia," which is a perfectly formed, three-foot-wide aluminum bowl exquisitely punctured by thousands of hand-drilled holes.

For the pierced work that has since become a signature style, Sirvet often favors polyethylene, a high-density plastic common in boats. He's used the material in commissions for U.S. Embassies in Malta and Dubai, and for a screen installed on the terrace of a private home—a massive

wall ornamented with 40,001 holes. (He can determine the exact number through AutoCAD, the computer-design program he used in his engineering days).

To fabricate his complex pieces, Sirvet turns to Products Support Inc., a precision manufacturing company whose clients include aerospace and defense contractors. He is in awe of their technical expertise in producing equipment accurate to within a thousandth of an inch.

"I come in and ask them to do fun, crazy things," says the sculptor. "They tell me, 'This is hard, and this is easy.' It's like when I was a structural engineer and I would figure out how to make a building stand up." He grins broadly. "Now I'm on the other side." •

Attention to Detail

Great Falls Construction emphasizes clients and customization

he custom home-building process is like a marriage," says Stacey Hoffman, president of Great Falls Construction, which has been building custom homes of all shapes, sizes and styles since 1979. "We work hand-inhand with clients from start to finish to incorporate all the elements of a project."

Hoffman, who joined the company nine years ago, feels that it's this customization that sets her firm apart. "What makes us different is that the homes we build are truly custom homes, whether they come from stock estate plans which we then modify, or the plans of an architect," she says. "Every detail is scrutinized and evaluated in terms of how the homeowner will live in the house. It's all based on specific use."

Great Falls Construction began life as a custom homebuilder, producing three to five new homes a year. With the downturn in the economy, however, business has evolved to include additions and renovations. The company now builds custom homes and works on a variety of remodeling projects.

Typically, a team is assigned to each project: the project manager, who interfaces with the homeowner on budget issues and hires the sub-contractors; and the project superintendent, who manages the day-to-day activity on site and monitors the other workers, controlling the quality of the work. "It's a testament to who we are and what we do that 60 percent of our clients are repeat customers," says Hoffman.

Recently, Great Falls Construction completed a home for a builder on the staff that Hoffman feels perfectly represents her company's innovative work and painstaking attention to detail. "We took the best of what we'd done in the past and incorporated it into the space," she explains. "It was a house we'd built before but we modified the plans to suit the owner."

Pictured on these pages, the 5,200-square-foot house is clad in stucco, cedar and stone. During the construction process, the builders tried to think ahead in terms of maintenance and longevity. For example, an extra layer of fiber mesh behind the stucco protects it from cracks and fissures while a drainage system behind the innately porous stone ensures that moisture is kept out. The Aura line of Benjamin Moore paint was used on the exterior because it retains the color against UV rays and prevents fading.

The house, which was designed by architects Mark Sullenberger and Richard Radcliffe of Custom Design Concepts in McLean, Virginia, includes 12 rooms, with 10-foot ceilings on the main level trimmed by wide crown moldings. A grand, two-story open entry boasts Crèma Marfil marble floors while the rest of the flooring is four-inch select white oak stained dark. "A lot of thought went into planning the flow," Hoffman says, referring particularly to the layout of the kitchen and family room. "All the elements—including builtins, kitchen and bath design and finishes—were done by us." �

owered by 100 years of history, the Howard Theatre once a draw for Ella Fitzgerald and James Brown—is about to open the curtain on a new era. Located in DC's Shaw neighborhood, this landmark building was a center of African-American culture known as "Black Broadway" for its vibrant jazz scene. Boarded up since 1980, the Howard Theatre has just been overhauled by architects Gary Martinez and Tom Johnson, who restored its regal facade and transformed the interiors into a state-of-the-art music venue with a \$2 million acoustic system. Interior designer Michael Marshall installed sleek, black-walnut walls and Brazilian granite bars. "We wanted to revive the theatre while preserving its history with a 21st-century means of expression," he explains. A restaurant and museum are now part of the mix. —Julie Sanders


